| 0 | SECTION 1. Subchapter J, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is |

- 10 11 amended by adding Sections 39.4525 and 39.4526 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 39.4525. COMMISSION ORDER. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, the commission may order an 13
- 14 electric utility subject to this subchapter to interact with, join,
- or submit to the operational control of a regional transmission 15 16 organization or independent system operator.
- (b) This section expires December 31, 2017. 17
- 18 Sec. 39.4526. HIRING ASSISTANCE FOR FEDERAL PROCEEDINGS.
- (a) The commission may engage any consultant, accountant, auditor, 19
- engineer, or attorney the commission considers necessary to assist 20
- 21 the commission in a proceeding before the Federal Energy Regulatory
- Commission, or before a court reviewing proceedings before the 22
- 23 federal commission, related to:
- 24 (1) the relationship of an electric utility subject to

- 1 this subchapter to a power region, regional transmission
- 2 organization, or independent system operator; or
- 3 (2) the approval of an agreement among the electric
- 4 utility and the electric utility's affiliates concerning the
- 5 coordination of the operations of the electric utility and the
- 6 electric utility's affiliates.
- 7 (b) Assistance for which a consultant, accountant, auditor,
- 8 engineer, or attorney may be engaged under Subsection (a) may
- 9 include:
- 10 (1) conducting a study;
- 11 (2) conducting an investigation;
- 12 <u>(3) presenting evidence;</u>
- 13 (4) advising the commission; or
- 14 (5) representing the commission.
- 15 <u>(c)</u> The electric utility shall reimburse the commission for
- 16 the reasonable costs of the services of a person engaged under
- 17 Subsection (a). The total amount of reimbursement required under
- 18 this subsection may not exceed \$1.5 million in a 12-month period.
- 19 (d) The commission shall allow the electric utility to
- 20 recover both the total amount the electric utility paid to
- 21 reimburse the commission under Subsection (c) and the carrying
- 22 charges for that reimbursement through a rider established annually
- 23 to recover the reimbursements paid and carrying charges incurred
- 24 during the preceding calendar year.
- (e) The commission shall consult the attorney general
- 26 before the commission engages a consultant, accountant, auditor, or
- 27 engineer under Subsection (a). The engagement of an attorney under

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- 1 Subsection (a) is subject to the approval of the attorney general
- 2 under Section 402.0212, Government Code.
- 3 <u>(f)</u> This section expires December 31, 2017.
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
