- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 56.021, Utilities Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 56.021. UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND ESTABLISHED. The
- 7 commission shall adopt and enforce rules requiring local exchange
- 8 companies to establish a universal service fund to:
- 9 (1) assist telecommunications providers in providing
- 10 basic local telecommunications service at reasonable rates in high
- 11 cost rural areas under two plans:
- 12 (A) the Texas High Cost Universal Service Plan
- 13 (16 T.A.C. Section 26.403); and
- 14 (B) the Small and Rural Incumbent Local Exchange
- 15 Company Universal Service Plan (16 T.A.C. Section 26.404);
- 16 (2) reimburse the telecommunications carrier that
- 17 provides the statewide telecommunications relay access service
- 18 under Subchapter D;
- 19 (3) finance the specialized telecommunications
- 20 assistance program established under Subchapter E;
- 21 (4) reimburse the department, the Texas Commission for
- 22 the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, and the commission for costs incurred
- 23 in implementing this chapter and Chapter 57;
- 24 (5) reimburse a telecommunications carrier providing

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- 1 lifeline service as provided by 47 C.F.R. Part 54, Subpart E, as
- 2 amended;
- 3 (6) finance the implementation and administration of
- 4 an integrated eligibility process created under Section 17.007 for
- 5 customer service discounts relating to telecommunications
- 6 services, including outreach expenses the commission determines
- 7 are reasonable and necessary;
- 8 (7) reimburse a designated provider under Subchapter
- 9 F;
- 10 (8) reimburse a successor utility under Subchapter G;
- 11 and
- 12 (9) finance the program established under Subchapter
- 13 H.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
