A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to transferring to the Texas Education Agency and the
- 3 commissioner of education the statutorily assigned
- 4 responsibilities of the State Board of Education concerning
- 5 textbooks.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Sections 7.108(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) A person interested in selling bonds of any type [or a
- 10 person engaged in manufacturing, shipping, selling, or advertising
- 11 textbooks or otherwise connected with the textbook business]
- 12 commits an offense if the person makes or authorizes a political
- 13 contribution to or takes part in, directly or indirectly, the
- 14 campaign of any person seeking election to or serving on the board.
- 15 (c) In this section, "political[+
- 16 [(1) "Political] contribution" has the meaning
- 17 assigned by Section 251.001, Election Code.
- 18 [(2) "Textbook" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 19 31.002.]
- SECTION 2. Section 7.112, Education Code, is amended by
- 21 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 22 (d) This section expires January 31, 2014.
- SECTION 3. Section 31.003, Education Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 31.003. RULES. The <u>commissioner</u> [State Board of
- 2 Education] may adopt rules, consistent with this chapter, for the
- 3 adoption, requisition, distribution, care, use, and disposal of
- 4 textbooks.
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 31.004, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 31.004. CERTIFICATION OF PROVISION OF TEXTBOOKS,
- 8 ELECTRONIC TEXTBOOKS, AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS. Each school
- 9 district and open-enrollment charter school shall annually certify
- 10 to [the State Board of Education and] the commissioner that, for
- 11 each subject in the required curriculum and each grade level, the
- 12 district provides each student with textbooks, electronic
- 13 textbooks, or instructional materials that cover all elements of
- 14 the essential knowledge and skills adopted by the State Board of
- 15 Education for that subject and grade level.
- SECTION 5. Sections 31.021(b) and (f), Education Code, are
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (b) The State Board of Education shall annually set aside
- 19 out of the available school fund of the state an amount sufficient
- 20 for the agency [board], school districts, and open-enrollment
- 21 charter schools to purchase and distribute the necessary textbooks
- 22 for the use of the students of this state for the following school
- 23 year. The board shall determine the amount of the available school
- 24 fund to set aside for the state textbook fund based on:
- 25 (1) a report by the commissioner issued on July 1 or,
- 26 if that date is a Saturday or Sunday, on the following Monday,
- 27 stating the amount of unobligated money in the fund;

- 1 (2) the commissioner's estimate, based on textbooks
- 2 selected under Section 31.101 and on attendance reports submitted
- 3 under Section 31.103 by school districts and open-enrollment
- 4 charter schools, of the amount of funds, in addition to funds
- 5 reported under Subdivision (1), that will be necessary for purchase
- 6 and distribution of textbooks for the following school year; and
- 7 (3) any amount the board determines should be set
- 8 aside for emergency purposes caused by unexpected increases in
- 9 attendance.
- 10 (f) The state textbook fund may be used to purchase
- 11 technological equipment necessary to support the use of electronic
- 12 textbooks or instructional material included on the list adopted
- 13 under Section 31.0231 or any textbook or material approved by the
- 14 agency [State Board of Education].
- 15 SECTION 6. Section 31.022, Education Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 31.022. TEXTBOOK REVIEW AND ADOPTION. (a) The agency
- 18 [State Board of Education] shall adopt a review and adoption cycle
- 19 for textbooks for elementary grade levels, including
- 20 prekindergarten, and secondary grade levels, for each subject in
- 21 the required curriculum under Section 28.002.
- 22 (b) The agency [board] shall organize the cycle for subjects
- 23 in the foundation curriculum so that not more than one-sixth of the
- 24 textbooks for subjects in the foundation curriculum are reviewed
- 25 each year. The commissioner [board] shall adopt rules to provide
- 26 for a full and complete investigation of textbooks for each subject
- 27 in the foundation curriculum at least every six years. The adoption

- 1 of textbooks for a subject in the foundation curriculum may be
- 2 extended beyond the six-year period only if the content of
- 3 textbooks for a subject is sufficiently current.
- 4 (c) The commissioner [board] shall adopt rules to provide
- 5 for a full and complete investigation of textbooks for each subject
- 6 in the enrichment curriculum on a cycle the <u>agency</u> [board]
- 7 considers appropriate.
- 8 (d) At least 24 months before the beginning of the school
- 9 year for which textbooks for a particular subject and grade level
- 10 will be purchased under the review and adoption cycle adopted by the
- 11 <u>agency</u> [board], the <u>agency</u> [board] shall publish notice of the
- 12 review and adoption cycle for those textbooks.
- 13 (e) The agency [board] shall designate a request for
- 14 production of textbooks in a subject area and grade level by the
- 15 school year in which the textbooks are intended to be made available
- 16 in classrooms and not by the school year in which the <u>agency</u> [board]
- 17 makes the request for production.
- 18 (f) The agency [board] shall amend any request for
- 19 production issued for the purchase of textbooks to conform to the
- 20 textbook funding levels provided by the General Appropriations Act
- 21 for the year of implementation.
- SECTION 7. Section 31.0221(a), Education Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (a) The commissioner [State Board of Education] shall adopt
- 25 rules for the midcycle review and adoption of a textbook for a
- 26 subject for which textbooks are not currently under review by the
- 27 agency [board] under Section 31.022. The rules must require:

- 1 (1) the publisher of the textbook to pay a fee to the
- 2 agency [board] to cover the cost of the midcycle review and adoption
- 3 of the textbook;
- 4 (2) the publisher of the textbook to enter into a
- 5 contract with the agency [board] concerning the textbook for a term
- 6 that ends at the same time as any contract entered into by the
- 7 <u>agency</u> [board] for another textbook for the same subject and grade
- 8 level; and
- 9 (3) a commitment from the publisher to provide the
- 10 textbook to school districts in the manner specified by the
- 11 publisher, which may include:
- 12 (A) providing the textbook to any district in a
- 13 regional education service center area identified by the publisher;
- 14 or
- 15 (B) providing a certain maximum number of
- 16 textbooks specified by the publisher.
- 17 SECTION 8. Section 31.0222, Education Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 31.0222. BUDGET-BALANCED CYCLE. In determining the
- 20 review and adoption cycle of textbooks under Section 31.022, the
- 21 <u>agency</u> [State Board of Education] shall:
- 22 (1) consult with the Legislative Budget Board and the
- 23 governor's office of budget, planning, and policy before approving
- 24 and publishing any notice or amendment of a cycle;
- 25 (2) review and consider:
- 26 (A) historic average funding levels for
- 27 textbooks purchased in previous bienniums;

- 1 (B) expected average costs of future textbook
- 2 purchases;
- 3 (C) anticipated student enrollment in future
- 4 years;
- 5 (D) scheduled revisions to curriculum; and
- 6 (E) the impact on the state budget of the
- 7 adoption of textbooks in all or some grade levels in a subject area;
- 8 and
- 9 (3) limit the cycle to subject areas for which
- 10 textbooks can be purchased with the funding anticipated to be
- 11 available in the state textbook fund for the school year in which
- 12 the textbooks are to be adopted.
- SECTION 9. Section 31.023(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (a) For each subject and grade level, the agency [State
- 16 Board of Education] shall adopt two lists of textbooks. The
- 17 conforming list includes each textbook submitted for the subject
- 18 and grade level that meets applicable physical specifications
- 19 adopted by the <u>agency</u> [State Board of Education] and contains
- 20 material covering each element of the essential knowledge and
- 21 skills of the subject and grade level in the student version of the
- 22 textbook, as well as in the teacher version of the textbook, as
- 23 determined [by the State Board of Education] under Section 28.002
- 24 and adopted under Section 31.024. The nonconforming list includes
- 25 each textbook submitted for the subject and grade level that:
- 26 (1) meets applicable physical specifications adopted
- 27 by the agency [State Board of Education];

- 1 (2) contains material covering at least half, but not
- 2 all, of the elements of the essential knowledge and skills of the
- 3 subject and grade level in the student version of the textbook, as
- 4 well as in the teacher version of the textbook; and
- 5 (3) is adopted under Section 31.024.
- 6 SECTION 10. Section 31.0231(c), Education Code, is amended 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (c) [Before the commissioner places an electronic textbook
- 9 or instructional material on the list adopted under Subsection (a),
- 10 the State Board of Education must be given an opportunity to comment
- 11 on the electronic textbook or instructional material.] An
- 12 electronic textbook or instructional material placed on the list
- 13 adopted under Subsection (a):
- 14 (1) must be reviewed and recommended to the
- 15 commissioner by a panel of recognized experts in the subject area of
- 16 the electronic textbook or instructional material and experts in
- 17 education technology;
- 18 (2) must satisfy criteria adopted for the purpose by
- 19 commissioner rule; and
- 20 (3) must meet the National Instructional Materials
- 21 Accessibility Standard, to the extent practicable as determined by
- 22 the commissioner.
- SECTION 11. Section 31.024, Education Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- Sec. 31.024. ADOPTION BY AGENCY [STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION].
- 26 (a) The agency [By majority vote, the State Board of Education]
- 27 shall:

- 1 (1) place each submitted textbook on a conforming or
- 2 nonconforming list; or
- 3 (2) reject a textbook submitted for placement on a
- 4 conforming or nonconforming list.
- 5 (b) Not later than December 1 of the year preceding the
- 6 school year for which the textbooks for a particular subject and
- 7 grade level will be purchased under the cycle adopted by the <u>agency</u>
- 8 [board] under Section 31.022, the agency [board] shall provide the
- 9 lists of adopted textbooks to each school district. Each
- 10 nonconforming list must include the reasons an adopted textbook is
- 11 not eligible for the conforming list.
- 12 SECTION 12. Section 31.0241(b), Education Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (b) The agency [State Board of Education] shall place an
- 15 open-source textbook for a secondary-level course submitted for
- 16 adoption by an eligible institution on a conforming or
- 17 nonconforming list if:
- 18 (1) the textbook is written, compiled, or edited
- 19 primarily by faculty of the eligible institution who specialize in
- 20 the subject area of the textbook;
- 21 (2) the eligible institution identifies each
- 22 contributing author;
- 23 (3) the appropriate department of the eligible
- 24 institution certifies the textbook for accuracy; and
- 25 (4) the eligible institution determines that the
- 26 textbook qualifies for placement on the conforming or nonconforming
- 27 list based on the extent to which the textbook covers the essential

- 1 knowledge and skills identified under Section 28.002 for the
- 2 subject for which the textbook is written and certifies that:
- 3 (A) for a textbook for a senior-level course, a
- 4 student who successfully completes a course based on the textbook
- 5 will be prepared, without remediation, for entry into the eligible
- 6 institution's freshman-level course in that subject; or
- 7 (B) for a textbook for a junior-level and
- 8 senior-level course, a student who successfully completes the
- 9 junior-level course based on the textbook will be prepared for
- 10 entry into the senior-level course.
- 11 SECTION 13. Section 31.025(a), Education Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (a) The agency [State Board of Education] shall set a limit
- 14 on the cost that may be paid from the state textbook fund for a
- 15 textbook placed on the conforming or nonconforming list for a
- 16 particular subject and grade level. The <u>agency</u> [board] may not
- 17 reject a textbook for placement on the conforming or nonconforming
- 18 list because the textbook's price exceeds the limit established
- 19 under this subsection.
- SECTION 14. Sections 31.026(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The <u>agency</u> [State Board of Education] shall execute a
- 23 contract:
- 24 (1) for the purchase of each adopted textbook other
- 25 than an electronic textbook; and
- 26 (2) for the purchase or licensing of each adopted
- 27 electronic textbook.

- 1 (b) A contract must require the publisher to provide the
- 2 number of textbooks required by school districts in this state for
- 3 the term of the contract, which must coincide with the <u>agency's</u>
- 4 [board's] adoption cycle.
- 5 SECTION 15. Section 31.0261, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 31.0261. CONTRACTS FOR PRINTING OF OPEN-SOURCE
- 8 TEXTBOOKS. The agency [State Board of Education] may execute a
- 9 contract for the printing of an open-source textbook listed on the
- 10 conforming or nonconforming list. The contract must allow a school
- 11 district to requisition printed copies of an open-source textbook
- 12 as provided by Section 31.103.
- SECTION 16. Sections 31.028(a), (b), and (c), Education
- 14 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) The <u>agency</u> [State Board of Education] may purchase
- 16 special textbooks for the education of blind and visually impaired
- 17 students in public schools. In addition, for a teacher who is blind
- 18 or visually impaired, the agency [board] shall provide a teacher's
- 19 edition in Braille or large type, as requested by the teacher, for
- 20 each textbook the teacher uses in the instruction of students. The
- 21 teacher edition must be available at the same time the student
- 22 textbooks become available.
- (b) The publisher of an adopted textbook shall provide the
- 24 agency with computerized textbook files for the production of
- 25 Braille textbooks or other versions of textbooks to be used by
- 26 students with disabilities, on request of the agency [State Board
- 27 of Education]. A publisher shall arrange computerized textbook

- 1 files in one of several optional formats specified by the agency
- 2 [State Board of Education].
- 3 (c) The agency [board] may also enter into agreements
- 4 providing for the acceptance, requisition, and distribution of
- 5 special textbooks and instructional aids pursuant to 20 U.S.C.
- 6 Section 101 et seq. for use by students enrolled in:
- 7 (1) public schools; or
- 8 (2) private nonprofit schools, if state funds, other
- 9 than for administrative costs, are not involved.
- SECTION 17. Section 31.029, Education Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 31.029. BILINGUAL TEXTBOOKS. The agency [board] shall
- 13 purchase or otherwise acquire textbooks for use in bilingual
- 14 education classes.
- 15 SECTION 18. Section 31.030, Education Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 31.030. USED TEXTBOOKS. The commissioner [State Board
- 18 of Education] shall adopt rules to ensure that used textbooks sold
- 19 to school districts and open-enrollment charter schools are not
- 20 sample copies that contain factual errors. The rules may provide
- 21 for the imposition of an administrative penalty in accordance with
- 22 Section 31.151 against a seller of used textbooks who knowingly
- 23 violates this section.
- 24 SECTION 19. Sections 31.035(a), (b), and (f), Education
- 25 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter,
- 27 the agency [State Board of Education] may adopt supplemental

- 1 textbooks that are not on the conforming or nonconforming list
- 2 under Section 31.023. The <u>agency</u> [State Board of Education] may
- 3 adopt a supplemental textbook under this section only if the
- 4 textbook:
- 5 (1) contains, as determined by the agency, material
- 6 covering one or more primary focal points or primary topics of a
- 7 subject in the required curriculum under Section $28.002[\frac{1}{7}]$ as
- 8 determined by the State Board of Education];
- 9 (2) is not designed to serve as the sole textbook for a
- 10 full course;
- 11 (3) meets applicable physical specifications adopted
- 12 by the agency [State Board of Education]; and
- 13 (4) is free from factual errors.
- 14 (b) The <u>agency</u> [State Board of Education] shall identify the
- 15 essential knowledge and skills identified under Section 28.002 that
- 16 are covered by a supplemental textbook adopted by the agency
- 17 [board] under this section.
- 18 (f) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 19 that requisitions supplemental textbooks under Subsection (d)(2)
- 20 shall certify to the agency that the supplemental textbooks, in
- 21 combination with any other textbooks or supplemental textbooks used
- 22 by the district or school, cover the essential knowledge and skills
- 23 identified under Section 28.002 [by the State Board of Education]
- 24 for the subject and grade level for which the district or school is
- 25 requisitioning the supplemental textbooks.
- SECTION 20. Section 31.073(b), Education Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

- 1 (b) If a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 2 selects a state-developed open-source textbook instead of another
- 3 textbook adopted under Subchapter B, the difference between the
- 4 cost determined by the commissioner under Subsection (a) and the
- 5 maximum price for a textbook in the same subject area, as determined
- 6 by the agency [State Board of Education] under Section 31.025,
- 7 shall be allocated as follows:
- 8 (1) 50 percent of the amount shall be credited to the
- 9 state textbook fund under Section 31.021 to be used for purposes of
- 10 this subchapter; and
- 11 (2) 50 percent of the amount shall be credited to the
- 12 school district or open-enrollment charter school for use as
- 13 provided by Section 31.1011(c).
- 14 SECTION 21. Sections 31.101(a), (c-1), and (d), Education
- 15 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) Each year, during a period established by the agency
- 17 [State Board of Education], the board of trustees of each school
- 18 district and the governing body of each open-enrollment charter
- 19 school shall:
- 20 (1) for a subject in the foundation curriculum, notify
- 21 the <u>agency</u> [State Board of Education] of the textbooks selected by
- 22 the board of trustees or governing body for the following school
- 23 year from among the textbooks on the appropriate conforming or
- 24 nonconforming list, including the list adopted under Section
- 25 31.0231; or
- 26 (2) for a subject in the enrichment curriculum:
- 27 (A) notify the agency [State Board of Education]

- 1 of each textbook selected by the board of trustees or governing body
- 2 for the following school year from among the textbooks on the
- 3 appropriate conforming or nonconforming list, including the list
- 4 adopted under Section 31.0231; or
- 5 (B) notify the agency [State Board of Education]
- 6 that the board of trustees or governing body has selected a textbook
- 7 that is not on the conforming or nonconforming list.
- 8 (c-1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
- 9 a school district or open-enrollment charter school must purchase a
- 10 classroom set of textbooks adopted by the agency [State Board of
- 11 Education] under Section 31.023 or 31.035 for each subject and
- 12 grade level in the foundation and enrichment curriculum.
- 13 (d) For a textbook that is not on the conforming or
- 14 nonconforming list, a school district or open-enrollment charter
- 15 school must use the textbook for the period of the review and
- 16 adoption cycle the <u>agency</u> [State Board of Education] has
- 17 established for the subject and grade level for which the textbook
- 18 is used.
- 19 SECTION 22. Section 31.103(b), Education Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 (b) A requisition for textbooks for the following school
- 22 year shall be based on the maximum attendance reports under
- 23 Subsection (a), plus an additional 10 percent, except as otherwise
- 24 provided. A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 25 shall make a requisition for a textbook on the conforming or
- 26 nonconforming list through the commissioner to the state depository
- 27 designated by the publisher or as provided by commissioner [State

- 1 Board of Education] rule, as applicable, not later than June 1 of each year. The designated state depository or, if the publisher or 2 3 manufacturer does not have a designated textbook depository in this state under Section 31.151(a)(6)(B), the publisher or manufacturer 4 shall fill a requisition approved by the agency at any other time in 5 the case of an emergency. As made necessary by available funds, the 6 commissioner shall reduce the additional percentage of attendance 7 8 for which a district or school may requisition textbooks. commissioner may, on application of a district or school that is 9 10 experiencing high enrollment growth, increase the additional

- Sec. 31.1031. SHORTAGE OF REQUISITIONED TEXTBOOKS. If a school district or open-enrollment charter school does not have a sufficient number of copies of a textbook used by the district or school for use during the following school year, and a sufficient number of additional copies will not be available from the depository or the publisher within the time specified by Section 31.151(a)(8), the district or school is entitled to:
- (1) be reimbursed from the state textbook fund, at a rate and in the manner provided by <u>commissioner</u> [State Board of Education] rule, for the purchase of a sufficient number of used adopted textbooks; or
- 26 (2) return currently used textbooks to the 27 commissioner in exchange for sufficient copies, if available, of

- 1 other textbooks on the conforming or nonconforming list to be used
- 2 during the following school year.
- 3 SECTION 24. Sections 31.151(a), (b), and (c), Education
- 4 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) A publisher or manufacturer of textbooks:
- 6 (1) shall furnish any textbook the publisher or
- 7 manufacturer offers in this state, at a price that does not exceed
- 8 the lowest price at which the publisher offers that textbook for
- 9 adoption or sale to any state, public school, or school district in
- 10 the United States;
- 11 (2) shall automatically reduce the price of a textbook
- 12 sold for use in a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 13 to the extent that the price is reduced elsewhere in the United
- 14 States;
- 15 (3) shall provide any textbook or ancillary item free
- 16 of charge in this state to the same extent that the publisher or
- 17 manufacturer provides the textbook or ancillary item free of charge
- 18 to any state, public school, or school district in the United
- 19 States;
- 20 (4) shall guarantee that each copy of a textbook sold
- 21 in this state is at least equal in quality to copies of that
- 22 textbook sold elsewhere in the United States and is free from
- 23 factual error;
- 24 (5) may not become associated or connected with,
- 25 directly or indirectly, any combination in restraint of trade in
- 26 textbooks or enter into any understanding or combination to control
- 27 prices or restrict competition in the sale of textbooks for use in

- 1 this state;
- 2 (6) shall:
- 3 (A) maintain a depository in this state or
- 4 arrange with a depository in this state to receive and fill orders
- 5 for textbooks, other than open-source textbooks, on-line
- 6 textbooks, or on-line textbook components, consistent with
- 7 commissioner [State Board of Education] rules; or
- 8 (B) deliver textbooks to a school district or
- 9 open-enrollment charter school without a delivery charge to the
- 10 school district, open-enrollment charter school, or state, if:
- 11 (i) the publisher or manufacturer does not
- 12 maintain or arrange with a depository in this state under Paragraph
- 13 (A) and the publisher's or manufacturer's textbooks and related
- 14 products are warehoused or otherwise stored less than 300 miles
- 15 from a border of this state; or
- 16 (ii) the textbooks are open-source
- 17 textbooks, on-line textbooks, or on-line textbook components;
- 18 (7) shall, at the time an order for textbooks is
- 19 acknowledged, provide to school districts or open-enrollment
- 20 charter schools an accurate shipping date for textbooks that are
- 21 back-ordered;
- 22 (8) shall guarantee delivery of textbooks at least 10
- 23 business days before the opening day of school of the year for which
- 24 the textbooks are ordered if the textbooks are ordered by a date
- 25 specified in the sales contract; and
- 26 (9) shall submit to the agency [State Board of
- 27 Education] an affidavit certifying any textbook the publisher or

- 1 manufacturer offers in this state to be free of factual errors at
- 2 the time the publisher executes the contract required by Section
- 3 31.026.
- 4 (b) The commissioner [State Board of Education] may impose a
- 5 reasonable administrative penalty against a publisher or
- 6 manufacturer who knowingly violates Subsection (a). The
- 7 <u>commissioner</u> [board] shall provide for a hearing to be held to
- 8 determine whether a penalty is to be imposed and, if so, the amount
- 9 of the penalty. The commissioner [board] shall base the amount of
- 10 the penalty on:
- 11 (1) the seriousness of the violation;
- 12 (2) any history of a previous violation;
- 13 (3) the amount necessary to deter a future violation;
- 14 (4) any effort to correct the violation; and
- 15 (5) any other matter justice requires.
- 16 (c) A hearing under Subsection (b) shall be held according
- 17 to rules adopted by the commissioner [State Board of Education].
- 18 SECTION 25. Section 31.201, Education Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 Sec. 31.201. DISPOSITION OF TEXTBOOKS. (a) The
- 21 commissioner[, with the approval of the State Board of Education,]
- 22 may provide for the disposition of:
- 23 (1) textbooks, other than electronic textbooks, that
- 24 are no longer in acceptable condition to be used for instructional
- 25 purposes; or
- 26 (2) discontinued textbooks, other than electronic
- 27 textbooks.

- 1 (b) The commissioner, as provided by rules adopted by the
- 2 commissioner [State Board of Education], shall make available on
- 3 request copies of discontinued textbooks, other than electronic
- 4 textbooks, for use in libraries maintained in municipal and county
- 5 jails, facilities operated by the Texas Department of Criminal
- 6 Justice for the imprisonment of individuals convicted of felonies
- 7 other than state jail felonies, and other state agencies.
- 8 (c) The commissioner [State Board of Education] shall adopt
- 9 rules under which a school district or open-enrollment charter
- 10 school may donate discontinued textbooks, other than electronic
- 11 textbooks, to a student, to an adult education program, or to a
- 12 nonprofit organization.
- 13 SECTION 26. Effective May 1, 2012, Section 7.102(c)(23),
- 14 Education Code, is repealed.
- 15 SECTION 27. (a) Effective May 1, 2012:
- 16 (1) all functions and activities concerning textbooks
- 17 performed by the State Board of Education immediately before that
- 18 date, other than such functions and activities assigned to the
- 19 board by the constitution of this state, are transferred to the
- 20 Texas Education Agency;
- 21 (2) a rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision of
- 22 the State Board of Education concerning textbooks, other than such
- 23 a rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision relating to a function
- 24 or activity assigned to the board by the constitution of this state,
- 25 continues in effect as a rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision
- 26 of the commissioner of education and remains in effect until
- 27 amended or replaced by the commissioner of education;

- 1 (3) a reference in law or an administrative rule to the
- 2 State Board of Education concerning textbooks means the
- 3 commissioner of education, other than such a reference to the State
- 4 Board of Education relating to a function or activity assigned to
- 5 the board by the constitution of this state;
- 6 (4) all money, contracts, leases, rights, property,
- 7 records, and bonds and other obligations of the State Board of
- 8 Education concerning textbooks are transferred to the Texas
- 9 Education Agency, except that money or a contract, lease, right,
- 10 property, record, or bond or other obligation relating to a
- 11 function or activity assigned to the board by the constitution of
- 12 this state is not transferred;
- 13 (5) a court case, administrative proceeding, contract
- 14 negotiation, or other proceeding involving the State Board of
- 15 Education concerning textbooks, other than such a proceeding
- 16 relating to a function or activity assigned to the board by the
- 17 constitution of this state, is transferred without change in status
- 18 to the commissioner of education, and the commissioner of education
- 19 assumes, without a change in status, the position of the State Board
- 20 of Education in a negotiation or proceeding relating to an activity
- 21 transferred by this Act to the commissioner of education to which
- 22 the State Board of Education is a party;
- 23 (6) an employee of the State Board of Education whose
- 24 duties relate solely or primarily to textbooks, other than such an
- 25 employee whose duties relate solely or primarily to a function or
- 26 activity assigned to the board by the constitution of this state,
- 27 becomes an employee of the Texas Education Agency; and

- 1 (7) any unexpended and unobligated balance of money
- 2 appropriated by the legislature for the State Board of Education to
- 3 carry out a function or activity related solely or primarily to
- 4 textbooks, other than money appropriated to enable the board to
- 5 carry out a function or activity assigned by the constitution of
- 6 this state, is transferred to the Texas Education Agency.
- 7 (b) In the period beginning on January 1, 2012, and ending
- 8 on April 30, 2012:
- 9 (1) the State Board of Education shall continue to
- 10 perform functions and activities under the Education Code or other
- 11 law as if the law had not been amended or repealed, as applicable,
- 12 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose; and
- 13 (2) a person who is authorized or required by law to
- 14 take an action relating to the State Board of Education or a member
- 15 of the State Board of Education shall continue to take that action
- 16 under the law as if the law had not been amended or repealed, as
- 17 applicable, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 18 purpose.
- 19 SECTION 28. Before May 1, 2012, the State Board of Education
- 20 may agree with the commissioner of education to transfer any
- 21 property of the State Board of Education to the Texas Education
- 22 Agency to implement the transfer required by Section 27 of this Act.
- 23 SECTION 29. This Act takes effect January 1, 2012.
