A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to compensation under the Crime Victims' Compensation Act for parents and guardians of certain deceased crime victims. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Article 56.32(a)(9), Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows: 6 "Pecuniary loss" means the amount of expense 7 (9) reasonably and necessarily incurred as a result of personal injury 8 or death for: 9 (A) medical, hospital, nursing, or psychiatric 10 care or counseling, or physical therapy; 11 12 (B) actual loss of past earnings and anticipated loss of future earnings and necessary travel expenses because of: 13 14 (i) a disability resulting from the 15 personal injury; 16 (ii) the receipt of medically indicated services related to the disability resulting from the personal 17 18 injury; or (iii) participation in or attendance 19 at 20 investigative, prosecutorial, or judicial processes related to the 21 criminally injurious conduct and participation in or attendance at any postconviction or postadjudication proceeding relating to 22 23 criminally injurious conduct; 24 (C) care of a child or dependent;

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amended by adding Subsection (d-1) to read as follows: 1 2 (d-1) A parent or guardian of a deceased victim 18 months of age or younger who suffered death as a result of criminally 3 injurious conduct that also resulted in damage to or loss of real or 4 5 personal property may receive a onetime-only assistance payment in an amount not to exceed: 6 7 (1) \$2,000 to be used for relocation expenses 8 described by Subsection (d)(1); and 9 (2) \$1,800 to be used for housing rental expenses. SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only 10 to a victim of a criminal offense committed or a violation that 11 occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. A criminal 12 offense committed or a violation that occurs before the effective 13 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the 14 15 offense was committed or the violation occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this 16 17 section, a criminal offense was committed or a violation occurred before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense 18 or violation occurred before that date. 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011. 20

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
