A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to cemeteries in certain municipalities.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 711.008, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (h) to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) Except as provided by Subsections (b), (f), (g), $\underline{\text{(h)}}$,
- 8 and (k), an individual, corporation, partnership, firm, trust, or
- 9 association may not establish or operate a cemetery, or use any land
- 10 for the interment of remains, located:
- 11 (1) in or within one mile of the boundaries of a
- 12 municipality with a population of 5,000 to 25,000;
- 13 (2) in or within two miles of the boundaries of a
- 14 municipality with a population of 25,000 to 50,000;
- 15 (3) in or within three miles of the boundaries of a
- 16 municipality with a population of 50,000 to 100,000;
- 17 (4) in or within four miles of the boundaries of a
- 18 municipality with a population of 100,000 to 200,000; or
- 19 (5) in or within five miles of the boundaries of a
- 20 municipality with a population of at least 200,000.
- 21 (h) Not later than September 1, 2014, a person may file a
- 22 written application with the governing body of a municipality to
- 23 establish or use a cemetery located inside the boundaries of the
- 24 municipality. The municipality by ordinance shall prescribe the

- 1 information to be included in the application. The governing body
- 2 by ordinance may authorize the establishment or use of a cemetery
- 3 <u>located</u> inside the boundaries of the municipality if the
- 4 municipality determines and states in the ordinance that the
- 5 establishment or use of the cemetery does not adversely affect
- 6 public health, safety, and welfare. This subsection applies only
- 7 to a municipality that:
- 8 <u>(1) is located in a county located on the</u>
- 9 international border;
- 10 (2) has a population of 75,000 or more; and
- 11 (3) has three or more cemeteries within its
- 12 boundaries.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
