## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to exemptions from groundwater conservation district
- 3 permit requirements.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 36.117(a), (b), (c), (d), (f), (h),
- 6 (i), (j), and (k), Water Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A district by rule may provide an exemption [exempt
- 8 wells from the district's requirement to obtain [of obtaining] a
- 9 drilling permit, an operating permit, or any other permit required
- 10 by this chapter or the district's rules.
- 11 (b) Except as provided by this section, a [A] district shall
- 12 provide an exemption from the district requirement to obtain a [may
- 13 not require any permit [issued by the district] for:
- 14 (1) drilling or operating a well used solely for
- 15 domestic use or for providing water for livestock or poultry if the
- 16 well is:
- 17 (A) located or to be located on a tract of land
- 18 larger than 10 acres; and
- 19 <u>(B)</u> [that is either] drilled, completed, or
- 20 equipped so that it is incapable of producing more than 25,000
- 21 gallons of groundwater a day;
- (2) [the] drilling [of] a water well used solely to
- 23 supply water for a rig that is actively engaged in drilling or
- 24 exploration operations for an oil or gas well permitted by the

- 1 Railroad Commission of Texas provided that the person holding the
- 2 permit is responsible for drilling and operating the water well and
- 3 the water well is located on the same lease or field associated with
- 4 the drilling rig; or
- 5 (3) [the] drilling [of] a water well authorized under
- 6 a permit issued by the Railroad Commission of Texas under Chapter
- 7 134, Natural Resources Code, or for production from the [such a]
- 8 well to the extent the withdrawals are required for mining
- 9 activities regardless of any subsequent use of the water.
- 10 (c) A district may not restrict the production of water from
- 11 any well <u>described</u> by [that is exempt from permitting under]
- 12 Subsection (b)(1).
- 13 (d) A [Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a] district may
- 14 cancel a previously granted exemption, and may require an operating
- 15 permit for or restrict production from a well, [to be permitted by
- 16 the district and to comply with all district rules] if:
- 17 (1) the [withdrawals from a] well is located in the
- 18 Hill Country Priority Groundwater Management Area and the
- 19 groundwater withdrawals that were exempted under Subsection (b)(1)
- 20 are no longer used solely for domestic use or to provide water for
- 21 livestock or poultry;
- 22 (2) the groundwater withdrawals that were [purpose of
- 23 a well] exempted under Subsection (b)(2) are [is] no longer used
- 24 solely to supply water for a rig that is actively engaged in
- 25 drilling or exploration operations for an oil or gas well permitted
- 26 by the Railroad Commission of Texas; or
- 27 (3) the groundwater withdrawals that were [from a

- 1 well] exempted under Subsection (b)(3) are no longer necessary for
- 2 mining activities or are greater than the amount necessary for
- 3 mining activities specified in the permit issued by the Railroad
- 4 Commission of Texas under Chapter 134, Natural Resources Code.
- 5 (f) A [Notwithstanding Subsection (d), a] district may
- 6 [not] require compliance with the district's well spacing rules for
- 7 the drilling of any [a] well except a well exempted under Subsection
- 8 (b)(3) [to comply with the spacing requirements of the district].
- 9 (h) A <u>district shall require the owner of a</u> water well <u>to</u>
- 10 [exempted under Subsection (a) or (b) shall]:
- 11 (1) register the well [be registered] in accordance
- 12 with rules promulgated by the district; and
- 13 (2) equip and maintain the well [be equipped and
- 14 maintained so as] to conform to the district's rules requiring
- 15 installation of casing, pipe, and fittings to prevent the escape of
- 16 groundwater from a groundwater reservoir to any reservoir not
- 17 containing groundwater and to prevent the pollution or harmful
- 18 alteration of the character of the water in any groundwater
- 19 reservoir.
- 20 (i) The driller of a well [exempted under Subsection (a) or
- 21 <del>(b)</del>] shall file [the drilling log] with the district the well log
- 22 required by Section 1901.251, Occupations Code, and, if available,
- 23 the geophysical log.
- 24 (j) An exemption provided under Subsection (b) does not
- 25 apply to a [A] well if the groundwater withdrawn is used to supply
- 26 water for a subdivision of land for which a plat approval is
- 27 required by Chapter 232, Local Government Code[, is not exempted

- 1 under Subsection (b)].
- 2 (k) Groundwater withdrawn [from a well exempt from
- 3 permitting or regulation] under an exemption provided in accordance
- 4 with this section and subsequently transported outside the
- 5 boundaries of the district is subject to any applicable production
- 6 and export fees under Sections 36.122 and 36.205.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
