1	AN ACT
2	relating to the practice of telemedicine.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 111, Occupations Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 111. TELEMEDICINE MEDICAL SERVICES [AND TELEHEALTH]
7	Sec. 111.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Advanced telecommunications technology" means
9	technology used for the transfer of data, not including telephone
10	or facsimile technology. The term includes:
11	(A) compressed digital interactive video, audio,
12	or data transmission;
13	(B) data transmission using computer imaging;
14	and
15	(C) other technology that facilitates access to
16	data.
17	(2) "Board" means the Texas Medical Board.
18	(3) "Telemedicine medical service" means a health care
19	service that is provided through the use of advanced
20	telecommunications technology for the purpose of:
21	(A) patient assessment, diagnosis, consultation,
22	or treatment; or
23	(B) the transfer of medical data.
24	(4) "Telemedicine provider" means:

No. 2333 1 (A) a physician who provides telemedicine medical services; or 2 3 (B) a physician assistant or advanced practice 4 nurse who: 5 (i) provides telemedicine medical 6 services; and (ii) is supervised by and has delegated 7 authority from a physician licensed in this state ['Health 8 professional' and 'physician' have the meanings assigned by Section 9 1455.001, Insurance Code. 10 [(2) 'Telehealth service' and 'telemedicine medical 11 service' have the meanings assigned by Section 57.042, Utilities 12 Code]. 13 14 Sec. 111.002. INFORMED CONSENT. A telemedicine provider 15 must [treating physician or health professional who provides or facilitates the use of telemedicine medical services or telehealth 16 17 services shall] ensure that the informed consent of the patient, or another appropriate individual authorized to make health care 18 19 treatment decisions for the patient, is obtained before telemedicine medical services [or telehealth 20 _services] are 21 provided. Sec. 111.003. CONFIDENTIALITY. A telemedicine provider 2.2 [treating physician or health professional who provides or 23 24 facilitates the use of telemedicine medical services or telehealth services] shall ensure that the confidentiality of the patient's 25 26 medical information is maintained as required by Chapter 159 or other applicable law. 27

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1 Sec. 111.004. RULES. The board [Texas State Board of Medical Examiners], in consultation with the commissioner of 2 insurance, as appropriate, may adopt rules necessary to implement 3 this chapter. The board may not adopt a rule to limit the provision 4 of telemedicine medical services by a telemedicine provider who 5 meets the requirements of this chapter and other applicable law[+ 6 7 [(1) ensure that patients using telemedicine medical 8 services receive appropriate, quality care; [(2) prevent abuse and fraud in the use of 9

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10 telemedicine medical services, including rules relating to the 11 filing of claims and records required to be maintained in 12 connection with telemedicine medical services;

13 [(3) ensure adequate supervision of health 14 professionals who are not physicians and who provide telemedicine 15 medical services;

16 [(4) establish the maximum number of health 17 professionals who are not physicians that a physician may supervise 18 through a telemedicine medical service; and

19 [(5) require a face-to-face consultation between a 20 patient and a physician providing a telemedicine medical service 21 within a certain number of days following an initial telemedicine 22 medical service only if the physician has never seen the patient].

23 Sec. 111.005. PROVISION OF TELEMEDICINE MEDICAL SERVICES.
24 (a) A telemedicine provider may provide telemedicine medical
25 services in this state only if the provider:

- 26 (1) is licensed in this state;
- 27 (2) has established a physician-patient relationship

1 with the recipient of the services; 2 (3) advises the patient to see a physician or other 3 health care professional in person within a reasonable time if the patient's symptoms do not improve; 4 5 (4) provides only services that are medically 6 indicated; 7 (5) adopts protocols to prevent fraud and abuse; 8 (6) does not violate state or federal laws relating to patient privacy; 9 (7) maintains medical records for all telemedicine 10 medical services; 11 12 (8) does not treat chronic pain with a controlled substance listed on Schedule II, III, IV, or V under Chapter 481, 13 14 Health and Safety Code, at a site other than a site normally used 15 for the provision of medical care; and 16 (9) practices the same standard of care as in a 17 traditional clinical setting. (b) A teleme<u>dicine provider may</u> <u>establ</u>ish 18 а 19 physician-patient relationship in an initial encounter using telemedicine medical services. 20 21 SECTION 2. Section 531.02161(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 2.2 (a) In this section, "telemedicine medical service" has the 23 24 meaning assigned by Section 111.001, Occupations [57.042,25 Utilities] Code. SECTION 3. The Texas Medical Board shall adopt rules to 26 27 implement Chapter 111, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act,

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1 not later than December 1, 2011.

2 SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this 3 section, this Act takes effect December 1, 2011.

4 (b) Section 3 of this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
