H.B. No. 2343

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of Asher's Law, the public health threat presented by youth suicide and to the prevention of associated 3 discrimination, harassment, bullying, and cyberbullying. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Asher's Law. 6 7 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that: (1) suicide committed by youth continues to present a 8 public health threat that endangers the well-being of the youth of 9 10 the state; 11 (2) suicide is the third leading cause of death for 12 persons who are at least 15 years of age but younger than 25 years of age and the sixth leading cause of death for persons who are at 13 14 least 5 years of age but younger than 15 years of age; 15 (3) youth feel the pressures of succeeding academically and socially, as well as the pressure of being 16 accepted by peers; 17 (4) research shows that bullying and harassment are 18 serious problems that impede the academic progress and overall 19 20 mental health of youth; 21 (5) youth who have or are perceived to have a certain 22 sexual orientation are subject to pervasive discrimination, 23 bullying, harassment, intimidation, and violence that puts their physical and mental health at risk; 24

(6) increased levels of victimization, as described by
 Subdivision (5), also lead to increased levels of depression and
 anxiety and decreased levels of self-esteem; and

4 (7) bullying and harassment, if left unaddressed, can5 lead and have led to life-threatening violence and suicide.

6 (8) Be it resolved that this act is dedicated to Asher 7 Brown and to every child that has fallen victim to the severe 8 emotional trauma caused by bullying and harassment.

9 SECTION 3. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended
10 by adding Subchapter O-1 to read as follows:

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SUBCHAPTER O-1. PREVENTION OF YOUTH SUICIDE

Sec. 161.325. SUICIDE PREVENTION. (a) The department, in coordination with the Texas Education Agency, shall develop a comprehensive suicide prevention program for implementation in public junior, middle, and high schools.

16 (b) The program must include components that provide for 17 training counselors, teachers, nurses, administrators, and other 18 staff, as well as law enforcement officers and social workers who 19 regularly interact with students, to:

20 (1) recognize students at risk of committing suicide, 21 including students who are or may be the victims of discrimination 22 or harassment prohibited by Section 11.174, Education Code, or 23 bullying prohibited in accordance with Section 37.0832, Education 24 Code; and

25 (2) intervene effectively with those students by 26 providing all appropriate assistance, including referrals for 27 mental health services.

H.B. No. 2343 (c) In developing the program, the department and the Texas 1 Education Agency may consider any existing suicide prevention 2 method developed by a school district under Section 11.252(a)(3)(B) 3 or 33.006(b)(1)(A), Education Code. 4 5 (d) The department may solicit and accept a gift, grant, or donation from any source for the development and implementation of 6 7 the program required by this section. 8 (e) Not later than January 1, 2013, the department shall submit a report to the legislature relating to the development and 9 implementation of the program required by this section. 10 This subsection expires September 1, 2013. 11 12 SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 11, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 11.174 to read as follows: 13 Sec. 11.174. DISCRIMINATION, HARASSMENT, AND RETALIATION 14 15 PROHIBITED. (a) In this section: (1) "Gender identity or expression" means a person's 16 17 having, or being perceived as having, a gender-related identity, appearance, expression, or behavior, whether or not that identity, 18 19 appearance, expression, or behavior is different from that commonly associated with the person's assigned sex at birth. 20 21 (2) "Sexual orientation" means heterosexuality, homosexuality, or bisexuality. 22 (b) A school district or employee of a school district may 23 24 not: 25 (1) discriminate against or harass an employee of the 26 district or a student enrolled in the district on account of: 27 (A) the actual or perceived ethnicity, color,

1 gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, 2 disability, religion, or national origin of the employee, student, 3 or student's parent; or 4 (B) one or more persons with whom the employee, 5 student, or student's parent associates; or 6 (2) retaliate against an employee of the district or a 7 student enrolled in the district for reporting potential 8 discrimination or harassment prohibited by Subdivision (1). 9 (c) This section applies to conduct that occurs: 10 on school property; (2) while attending a school-sponsored or 11 12 school-related activity on or off of school property; or (3) in connection with transportation of students in a 13 14 vehicle owned or operated by a school district or owned or operated 15 by another entity under contract with a school district. (d) A school district shall provide periodic training to 16 17 district employees regarding prevention of discrimination and harassment prohibited by this section and procedures for responding 18 to reported or observed incidents of prohibited discrimination or 19 harassment. The training may be provided in conjunction with any 20 training provided under Section 37.083. 21 (e) In accordance with rules adopted by the commissioner, 22 each school district shall report annually to the agency 23 24 information regarding each incident of alleged discrimination or harassment that occurred at each campus in the district during the 25 26 preceding year. The agency shall include the information, disaggregated by campus, in the comprehensive annual report 27

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1 required by Section 39.332. 2 SECTION 5. The heading to Section 25.0342, Education Code, 3 is amended to read as follows: 4 Sec. 25.0342. TRANSFER OF STUDENTS WHO ARE VICTIMS OF OR HAVE ENGAGED IN BULLYING. 5 6 SECTION 6. Section 25.0342, Education Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsections (a), (c), and (e) and adding Subsections (b-1) 8 and (b-2) to read as follows: (a) 9 In this section, "bullying" has the meaning assigned by 10 Section 37.0832 [means engaging in written or verbal expression or physical conduct that a school district board of trustees or 11 12 board's designee determines: [(1) will have the effect of physically harming a 13 14 student, damaging a student's property, or placing a student in 15 reasonable fear of harm to the student's person or of damage to the 16 student's property; or 17 [(2) is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive enough that the action or threat creates an intimidating, 18 threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student]. 19 (b-1) On the request of a parent or other person with 20 authority to act on behalf of a student who is a victim of bullying, 21 the board of trustees of a school district or the board's designee 22 may transfer the student who engaged in bullying to: 23 24 (1) another classroom at the campus to which the 25 victim was assigned at the time the bullying occurred; or 26 (2) a campus in the district other than the campus to which the victim was assigned at the time the bullying occurred. 27

1 (b-2) To the extent practicable, the board of trustees and 2 each district educator with knowledge of the request shall keep a 3 request received under Subsection (b) or (b-1) confidential.

4 (c) The board of trustees or the board's designee shall
5 verify that a student has been a victim of <u>or has engaged in</u>
6 bullying<u>, as applicable</u>, before transferring the student under this
7 section.

8 (e) <u>A</u> [The] determination by the board of trustees or the 9 board's designee <u>under this section</u> is final and may not be 10 appealed.

11 SECTION 7. Section 37.001(b), Education Code, is amended to 12 read as follows:

13 (b) In this section:

14 (1) "Bullying" has the meaning assigned by Section
15 <u>37.0832.</u>

16 (2) "Harassment" means threatening to cause harm or 17 bodily injury to another student, engaging in sexually intimidating 18 conduct, causing physical damage to the property of another 19 student, subjecting another student to physical confinement or 20 restraint, or maliciously taking any action that substantially 21 harms another student's physical or emotional health or safety.

22 (3) [(2)] "Hit list" means a list of people targeted 23 to be harmed, using: 24 (A) a firearm, as defined by Section 46.01(3), 25 Penal Code; 26 (B) a knife, as defined by Section 46.01(7),

27 Penal Code; or

H.B. No. 2343 1 (C) any other object to be used with intent to cause bodily harm. 2 SECTION 8. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is 3 amended by adding Section 37.0832 to read as follows: 4 5 Sec. 37.0832. POLICY PROHIBITING BULLYING, INCLUDING CYBERBULLYING; REPORT. (a) In this section: 6 7 (1) "Bullying": 8 (A) means engaging in written or verbal expression or physical conduct, including an action motivated by 9 the perceived or actual characteristics, behavior, or beliefs of a 10 student, that: 11 12 (i) will have the effect of physically harming a student, damaging a student's property, or placing a 13 student in reasonable fear of harm to the student's person or of 14 15 damage to the student's property; (ii) is sufficiently severe, persistent, or 16 17 pervasive enough that the action or threat creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student; 18 19 (iii) interferes with a student's 20 educational opportunities; or 21 (iv) substantially disrupts the operation of 22 a school; and 23 (B) includes cyberbullying. 24 (2) "Cyberbullying" means bullying, harassment, or intimidation that is done using electronic communication, 25 26 including electronic media. 27 (b) The board of trustees of each school district shall

1 adopt a policy concerning bullying that: 2 (1) prohibits bullying of a student; (2) prohibits retaliation against any person, 3 including a victim, witness, or another person, who in good faith 4 5 provides information concerning an incident of bullying; and 6 (3) addresses any other issue concerning bullying that 7 the board of trustees determines to be appropriate. 8 (c) Each school district shall: 9 (1) provide annual written notice of the policy 10 adopted under Subsection (b) to each district student, the parent or guardian of each district student, and each district employee or 11 12 volunteer; 13 (2) post the policy on district and campus Internet 14 websites; and 15 (3) include the policy in student and employee 16 handbooks. 17 (d) In accordance with rules adopted by the commissioner, each school district shall report annually to the agency 18 information regarding each incidence of alleged bullying that 19 occurred at each campus in the district during the preceding year. 20 21 The agency shall include the information, disaggregated by campus, in the comprehensive annual report required by Section 39.332. 22 SECTION 9. (a) Each school district shall submit to the 23 24 Texas Education Agency information as required under Sections 11.174(e) and 37.0832(d), Education Code, as added by this Act, 25 beginning with the 2012-2013 school year based on incidents of 26 27 discrimination, harassment, and bullying during the 2011-2012

1 school year.

Texas Education Agency shall include 2 (b) The the information required under Sections 11.174(e) and 37.0832(d), 3 Education Code, as added by this Act, in the comprehensive annual 4 report required by Section 39.332, Education Code, beginning with 5 6 the report required to be submitted not later than December 1, 2012. 7 SECTION 10. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012 8 school year.

9 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect immediately if it 10 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 11 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 12 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 13 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
