2	relating to the authority of a municipality, a county, or the
3	Department of Public Safety to enforce compliance with posted speed
4	limits by an automated traffic control system.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 542.2035, Transportation Code, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	Sec. 542.2035. LIMITATION ON MUNICIPALITIES AND COUNTIES.
9	(a) A municipality or county may not implement or operate ar
10	automated traffic control system with respect to a highway or
11	street under its jurisdiction for the purpose of enforcing
12	compliance with posted speed limits. The attorney general shall
13	enforce this subsection.
14	(b) In this section, "automated traffic control system"
15	means a photographic device, radar device, laser device, or other
16	electrical or mechanical device designed to:
17	(1) record the speed of a motor vehicle; [and]

- (2) obtain one or more photographs or other recorded 18
- 19 images of:
- (A) the vehicle; 20
- 21 (B) the license plate attached to the vehicle; or
- the operator of the vehicle; and 22
- 23 (3) permit the issuance of a citation without the
- personal and contemporaneous involvement of a peace officer. 24

- 1 (c) This section does not prohibit a municipality or county
- 2 from using a device that records the speed of a motor vehicle and
- 3 obtains photographs or other recorded images listed in Subsection
- 4 (b)(2), or from relying on evidence obtained from using the device
- 5 in the prosecution of a criminal offense, if:
- 6 (1) the device is used by a peace officer who
- 7 personally observes the violation and issues a citation to the
- 8 operator of the vehicle at the time of the violation or is unable to
- 9 issue the citation because of events beyond the control of the peace
- 10 officer; or
- 11 (2) the device is used by a peace officer working in a
- 12 team of peace officers engaged in a localized collective effort to
- 13 enforce compliance with posted speed limits, the peace officer
- 14 personally observes the violation, and another peace officer
- 15 working in the same team issues a citation to the operator of the
- 16 vehicle at the time of the violation or is unable to issue the
- 17 citation because of events beyond the control of the peace officer.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 542, Transportation Code,
- 19 is amended by adding Section 542.207 to read as follows:
- Sec. 542.207. LIMITATION ON DEPARTMENT. (a) In this
- 21 section, "automated traffic control system" has the meaning
- 22 <u>assigned by Section 542.2035(b).</u>
- 23 (b) The department may not implement or operate an automated
- 24 traffic control system for the purpose of enforcing compliance with
- 25 posted speed limits. The attorney general shall enforce this
- 26 section.
- 27 (c) This section does not prohibit the department from using

- 1 a device that records the speed of a motor vehicle and obtains
- 2 photographs or other recorded images listed in Section
- 3 542.2035(b)(2), or from relying on evidence obtained from using the
- 4 device in the prosecution of a criminal offense, if:
- 5 (1) the device is used by a peace officer who
- 6 personally observes the violation and issues a citation to the
- 7 operator of the vehicle at the time of the violation or is unable to
- 8 issue the citation because of events beyond the control of the peace
- 9 officer; or
- 10 (2) the device is used by a peace officer working in a
- 11 team of peace officers engaged in a localized collective effort to
- 12 enforce compliance with posted speed limits, the peace officer
- 13 personally observes the violation, and another peace officer
- 14 working in the same team issues a citation to the operator of the
- 15 vehicle at the time of the violation or is unable to issue the
- 16 citation because of events beyond the control of the peace officer.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
