## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to certain responsibilities of education research centers
- 3 and to a joint advisory board for education research centers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1.005, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsections (l) and (m) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (e) A center shall conduct research for the benefit of
- 9 education in this state, including research relating to the impact
- 10 of state and federal education programs, the performance of
- 11 educator preparation programs, public school finance, and the best
- 12 practices of school districts with regard to classroom instruction,
- 13 bilingual education programs, special language programs, and
- 14 business practices. A center shall support policy and academic
- 15 research, including support of attainment of doctoral degrees in
- 16 this state.
- 17 (1) Each center shall adopt and, after approval by the joint
- 18 advisory board as provided for under Section 1.006(e)(4),
- 19 administer a process for reviewing research proposals and
- 20 forwarding to the joint advisory board only proposals of high
- 21 quality.
- 22 (m) On behalf of a center, the commissioner of education and
- 23 the coordinating board may pursue and enter data reciprocity
- 24 agreements with:

- 1 (1) another agency of this state; and
- 2 (2) the state education agency of another state,
- 3 giving priority to the agencies of those states that send the
- 4 highest number of students to this state or that receive the highest
- 5 number of students from this state.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 1, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 7 Section 1.006 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 1.006. JOINT ADVISORY BOARD FOR EDUCATION RESEARCH
- 9 CENTERS. (a) In this section, "center" means a center for education
- 10 research authorized by Section 1.005.
- 11 (b) The commissioner of education and the commissioner of
- 12 higher education shall co-chair a joint advisory board to adopt
- 13 policies governing the operations of the centers, including a
- 14 process for review and approval of center research involving
- 15 confidential information. The commissioner of education and the
- 16 commissioner of higher education each may delegate duties as
- 17 co-chair, including voting, to an employee of the Texas Education
- 18 Agency or the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, as
- 19 appropriate.
- 20 (c) The commissioner of education and the commissioner of
- 21 <u>higher education shall jointly appoint not more than 10 additional</u>
- 22 members to the joint advisory board to serve one-year terms. A
- 23 member of the joint advisory board serves at the pleasure of the
- 24 commissioner of education and the commissioner of higher education.
- 25 A member may be reappointed each year to an additional term.
- 26 (d) The joint advisory board shall meet at the call of the
- 27 co-chairs at least twice each year.

- 4 (2) develop a plan for establishing access at public
- 5 <u>institutions of higher education to center research;</u>
- 6 (3) develop policies to give state agencies acting for
- 7 a governmental purpose and public entities performing studies
- 8 authorized by the legislature priority in access to and use of
- 9 center research;
- 10 (4) provide for approving a process developed under
- 11 Section 1.005(1) for reviewing center research proposals and
- 12 forwarding only proposals of high quality to the joint advisory
- 13 board;
- 14 (5) identify, in consultation with each center, the
- 15 type of data that the Texas Education Agency sends annually to each
- 16 center without the necessity of a request for that data by a center
- 17 and a schedule on which the data is sent; and
- 18 (6) perform other duties as necessary to advise each
- 19 center.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
