- not required to be accredited by a national organization before 8
- January 1, 2014, unless, not later than September 1, 2012, the 9
- department sets an earlier date in accordance with a recommendation 10
- of the advisory council established under Section 773.012. 11
- 12 (b-2) Not later than January 1, 2013, the department shall
- partner with a testing entity that administers an examination that 13
- 14 qualifies the examinee for licensure as a paramedic.
- department may not reimburse the testing entity for administering 15
- 16 an examination, but the testing entity may charge a fee to an
- examinee. This subsection expires January 1, 2015. 17
