1 AN ACT 2 relating to the accreditation of training programs and examinations for certain emergency medical services personnel. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 773.050, Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended by adding Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to read as follows: 6 (b-1) A paramedic education course or training program is 7 not required to be accredited by a national organization before 8 January 1, 2014, unless, not later than September 1, 2012, the 9 department sets an earlier date in accordance with a recommendation 10 of the advisory council established under Section 773.012. 11 12 (b-2) Not later than January 1, 2013, the department shall partner with a testing entity that administers an examination that 13 14 qualifies the examinee for licensure as a paramedic. The department may not reimburse the testing entity for administering 15 16 an examination, but the testing entity may charge a fee to an examinee. This subsection expires January 1, 2015. 17

18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
