- 11 negotiation or proceeding to which the Texas Facilities Commission
- 12 is a party.

- 14 obligations of the Texas Facilities Commission are transferred to
- 15 the General Land Office.
- 16 (e) All personal property, including records, in the
- 17 custody of the Texas Facilities Commission becomes the property of
- 18 the General Land Office.
- 19 (f) All funds appropriated by the legislature to the Texas
- 20 Facilities Commission are transferred to the General Land Office.
- 21 SECTION 21. This Act takes effect October 1, 2011.
