10	SECTION 2. Section 2307.001, Occupations Code, is amended
11	by adding Subdivisions (1-a), (1-b), and (6-a) to read as follows:
12	(1-a) "Automotive glass repair service" means a person
13	that engages in the business of automotive glass work.
14	(1-b) "Automotive glass work" means the installation,
15	maintenance, or repair of fixed or moveable glass in a motor
16	vehicle.
17	(6-a) "Third-party administrator" means a person,
18	other than a person licensed or otherwise authorized to engage in
19	business under Title 13, Insurance Code, that, in connection with

- 3 SECTION 3. Chapter 2307, Occupations Code, is amended by

- 5 Sec. 2307.0025. DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICE. (a) A
- 6 third-party administrator that holds at least a 10 percent
- 7 ownership interest in an automotive glass repair service may not:
- 8 (1) refer a third-party claimant or an insured to the

- 10 (2) coerce a third-party claimant or an insured to use
