 9 <u>Sec. 301.358. DUTY TO ASSESS MEDICAL ORDER. A registered</u>

- 13 <u>(1) issued by a person who is legally authorized to</u>
 14 issue the order; and
- 15 (2) in the best interest of the patient.
- SECTION 2. Section 301.413(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (b) A person may not suspend, terminate, or otherwise
- 19 discipline or discriminate against a person who:
- 20 (1) reports, without malice, under this subchapter;
- 21 (2) requests, in good faith, a nursing peer review
- 22 committee determination under Section 303.005; [or]
- 23 (3) refuses to engage in conduct as authorized by
- 24 Section 301.352;

- 1 (4) exercises the right of free speech relating to a
- 2 report filed under this subchapter, regardless of whether the
- 3 expression is made while on duty;
- 4 (5) engages, in good faith, in collective patient
- 5 <u>advocacy; or</u>
- 6 (6) refuses, in good faith, an unsafe assignment.
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 303.005, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 8 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 (b) If a person who is required to establish a nursing peer
- 11 review committee under Section 303.0015 requests a nurse to engage
- 12 in conduct that the nurse believes violates a nurse's duty to a
- 13 patient, the nurse may:
- 14 (1) request, on a form developed or approved by the
- 15 board, a determination by a nursing peer review committee under
- 16 this chapter of whether the conduct violates a nurse's duty to a
- 17 patient; or
- 18 (2) refuse the request if the nurse believes, in good
- 19 faith, that the conduct is unsafe.
- 20 (c-1) A nurse who refuses to engage in conduct as provided
- 21 by Subsection (b)(2):
- (1) may not be disciplined or discriminated against
- 23 for making the refusal;
- 24 (2) shall file a report under Section 301.4025 against
- 25 the person making the request under Subsection (a); and
- 26 (3) may not be disciplined by the board for refusing to
- 27 engage in that conduct.
