REVOCATION: PERSON UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE. 7 (a) Unless the person complies with the requirements of Subsection 8 9 (b), the department shall revoke the license of a person under 18 years of age who is enrolled at a public school, home school, or 10 private school if: 11 12 (1) the person's parent or guardian notifies the department that the person has been absent from school for at least 13 14 10 consecutive instructional days; or (2) a school administrator or law enforcement officer 15 16 notifies the department that the person has been absent from school for at least 20 consecutive instructional days. 17 (b) The department shall notify the person in writing of a 18 19 truancy report made against the person under Subsection (a). The revocation of a license by the department under this section 20 becomes effective on the 30th day after the date of the notice, 21 unless before that date the person provides to the department 22 23 information required by the department to demonstrate the person's 24 school attendance.

Section 545.424, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections (a-1) 9 and (b-1) to read as follows: 10 (a) A person under 18 years of age may not operate a motor 11 12 vehicle while using a wireless communications device, except in 13 case of emergency. 14 (a-1) A person under 18 years of age may not operate a motor 15 vehicle[+ 16 [(1)] during the 12-month period following issuance of 17 an original Class A, B, or C driver's license to the person: (1) [(A)] after midnight and before 5 a.m. unless the 18 19 operation of the vehicle is necessary for the operator to attend or participate in employment or a school-related activity or because 20 of a medical emergency; or 21 (2) [(B)] with more than one passenger in the vehicle 22 23 under 21 years of age who is not a family member [; or 24 [(2) while using a wireless communications device, 25 except in case of emergency]. A person under 17 years of age who holds a restricted 26 (b) motorcycle license or moped license may not operate a motorcycle or 27
