## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the interest of a governmental entity in a life
- 3 insurance policy insuring the life of an employee or retired
- 4 employee of the governmental entity.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 1103, Insurance Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 1103.006 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 1103.006. LOCAL GOVERNMENT OR STATE AGENCY AS
- 9 BENEFICIARY. A local government or state agency, as defined by
- 10 <u>Section 2256.002</u>, <u>Government Code</u>, <u>or an assignee or designee of a</u>
- 11 local government or state agency may be designated as a beneficiary
- 12 <u>in a policy that insures the life of an employee or retired employee</u>
- 13 of the local government or state agency or an individual who was an
- 14 employee of a local government or state agency at the time the life
- 15 insurance policy was issued but subsequently ceased employment for
- 16 <u>any reason</u>.
- 17 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 2256, Government Code, is
- 18 amended by adding Section 2256.0165 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 2256.0165. AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS: GOVERNMENTAL
- 20 EMPLOYEE LIFE INSURANCE POLICIES. A life insurance policy that
- 21 insures the life of an employee or retired employee of a local
- 22 government or state agency, or an individual who was an employee of
- 23 <u>a local government or state agency at the time the life insurance</u>
- 24 policy was issued but subsequently ceased employment for any

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- 1 reason, and designates the local government or state agency or an
- 2 assignee or designee of the local government or state agency as a
- 3 beneficiary, is an authorized investment of the local government or
- 4 state agency under this subchapter if:
- 5 (1) the life insurance policy allows the employee or
- 6 retired employee to designate a beneficiary for a portion of the
- 7 policy; and
- 8 (2) the local government or state agency allows the
- 9 employee or retired employee to decline coverage under the policy.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
