A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation of a prescription medication information
- 3 literacy plan and pilot programs to implement that plan.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 107A, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 6 by designating Sections 107A.001, 107A.002, and 107A.003, Health
- 7 and Safety Code, as Subchapter A, Chapter 107A, Health and Safety
- 8 Code, and adding a heading to Subchapter A to read as follows:

9 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 107A, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 11 by adding Subchapter B to read as follows:
- 12 SUBCHAPTER B. PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION INFORMATION LITERACY
- Sec. 107A.051. DEVELOPMENT OF LITERACY PLAN. (a) The
- 14 office shall develop a prescription medication information
- 15 literacy plan to improve patient compliance with physician
- 16 instructions for taking prescription medication.
- 17 (b) Medication literature created or modified under the
- 18 plan must:

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- (1) be appropriate for the literacy level of the
- 20 general population of this state, including persons who receive
- 21 medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, and the
- 22 parents or guardians of children covered by the child health plan
- 23 under Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code;
- 24 (2) be written in a format that is easy to understand;

- 1 (3) be available in English, Spanish, and any other
- 2 language appropriate to the demographic needs of the area in which
- 3 the pharmacy distributing the prescriptions is located; and
- 4 (4) include additional information to assist a person
- 5 in complying with physician instructions for taking the medication
- 6 and receiving the best therapeutic benefit from the medication.
- 7 (c) The office shall identify the best methods and practices
- 8 for producing medically accurate information that meets the
- 9 criteria in Subsection (b) and disseminating that information.
- Sec. 107A.052. PILOT PROGRAMS. (a) The office shall create
- 11 pilot programs to implement the provisions of the prescription
- 12 medication information literacy plan developed under Section
- 13 107A.051.
- 14 (b) In selecting locations for the pilot programs under this
- 15 section, the office shall identify areas in which a significant
- 16 portion of the population is covered by:
- 17 (1) the medical assistance program under Chapter 32,
- 18 Human Resources Code; or
- 19 (2) the child health plan under Chapter 62, Health and
- 20 Safety Code.
- 21 <u>(c)</u> The office shall implement:
- 22 (1) at least one pilot program in a rural area; and
- 23 (2) at least one pilot program in an urban area.
- 24 (d) The office may implement pilot programs in addition to
- 25 the pilot programs described by Subsection (c) if funding is
- 26 available.
- (e) The office may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and

- 1 donations to support the pilot programs under this section.
- 2 (f) The office shall provide training and outreach to
- 3 pharmacists and pharmacy staff in areas covered by a pilot program
- 4 under this section to ensure proper use of the literature developed
- 5 under Section 107A.051.
- 6 (g) Each pharmacy in an area covered by the pilot program
- 7 shall implement the provisions of the plan developed under Section
- 8 107A.051.
- 9 (h) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 10 <u>Services Commission may adopt rules necessary for the</u>
- 11 implementation of the pilot programs under this section.
- 12 (i) Not later than January 1, 2013, the office shall submit
- 13 a report to the legislature on:
- 14 (1) the efficacy of pilot programs implemented under
- 15 this section; and
- 16 (2) recommendations for legislation to improve health
- 17 prescription medication information literacy.
- 18 (j) This section expires September 1, 2013.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
