4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter GG to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER GG. TEXAS EMERGENCY AND TRAUMA CARE EDUCATION
8	PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

- Sec. 61.9801. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 9
- (1) "Emergency and trauma care education partnership" 10
- 11 means a partnership that:
- 12 (A) consists of one or more hospitals in this
- 13 state and one or more graduate professional nursing or graduate
- 14 medical education programs in this state; and
- (B) serves to increase training opportunities in 15
- 16 emergency and trauma care for doctors and registered nurses at
- participating graduate medical education and graduate professional 17
- nursing programs. 18
- (2) "Participating education program" means a 19
- graduate professional nursing program as that term is defined by 20
- 21 Section 54.221 or a graduate medical education program leading to
- board certification by the American Board of Medical Specialties 22
- 23 that participates in an emergency and trauma care education
- 24 partnership.

- 1 Sec. 61.9802. PROGRAM: ESTABLISHMENT; ADMINISTRATION;
- 2 PURPOSE. (a) The Texas emergency and trauma care education
- 3 partnership program is established.
- 4 (b) The board shall administer the program in accordance
- 5 with this subchapter and rules adopted under this subchapter.
- 6 (c) Under the program, to the extent funds are available
- 7 under Section 61.9805, the board shall make grants to emergency and
- 8 trauma care education partnerships to assist those partnerships to
- 9 meet the state's needs for doctors and registered nurses with
- 10 training in emergency and trauma care by offering one-year or
- 11 two-year fellowships to students enrolled in graduate professional
- 12 nursing or graduate medical education programs through
- 13 collaboration between hospitals and graduate professional nursing
- 14 or graduate medical education programs and the use of the existing
- 15 <u>expertise and facilities of those hospitals and programs.</u>
- Sec. 61.9803. GRANTS: CONDITIONS; LIMITATIONS. (a) The
- 17 board may make a grant under this subchapter to an emergency and
- 18 trauma care education partnership only if the board determines
- 19 that:
- 20 (1) the partnership will meet applicable standards for
- 21 instruction and student competency for each program offered by each
- 22 participating education program;
- 23 (2) each participating education program will, as a
- 24 result of the partnership, enroll in the education program a
- 25 sufficient number of additional students as established by the
- 26 board;
- 27 (3) each hospital participating in an emergency and

- 1 trauma care education partnership will provide to students enrolled
- 2 in a participating education program clinical placements that:
- 3 (A) allow the students to take part in providing
- 4 or to observe, as appropriate, emergency and trauma care services
- 5 offered by the hospital; and
- 6 (B) meet the clinical education needs of the
- 7 students; and
- 8 (4) the partnership will satisfy any other requirement
- 9 established by board rule.
- 10 (b) A grant under this subchapter may be spent only on
- 11 costs related to the development or operation of an emergency and
- 12 trauma care education partnership that prepares a student to
- 13 complete a graduate professional nursing program with a specialty
- 14 focus on emergency and trauma care or earn board certification by
- 15 <u>the American Board of Medical Specialties.</u>
- Sec. 61.9804. PRIORITY FOR FUNDING. In awarding a grant
- 17 under this subchapter, the board shall give priority to an
- 18 emergency and trauma care education partnership that submits a
- 19 proposal that:
- 20 (1) provides for collaborative educational models
- 21 between one or more participating hospitals and one or more
- 22 participating education programs that have signed a memorandum of
- 23 understanding or other written agreement under which the
- 24 participants agree to comply with standards established by the
- 25 board, including any standards the board may establish that:
- 26 (A) provide for program management that offers a
- 27 centralized decision-making process allowing for inclusion of each

1 entity participating in the partnership; 2 (B) provide for access to clinical training positions for students in graduate professional nursing and 3 graduate medical education programs that are not participating in 4 5 the partnership; and 6 (C) specify the details of any requirement 7 relating to a student in a participating education program being employed after graduation in a hospital participating in the 8 partnership, including any details relating to the employment of 9 10 students who do not complete the program, are not offered a position at the hospital, or choose to pursue other employment; 11 12 (2) includes a demonstrable education model to: (A) increase the number of students enrolled in, 13 the number of students graduating from, and the number of faculty 14 15 employed by each participating education program; and 16 (B) improve student or resident retention in each 17 participating education program; (3) indicates the availability of money to match a 18 portion of the grant money, including matching money or in-kind 19 services approved by the board from a hospital, private or 20 nonprofit entity, or institution of higher education; 21 22 (4) can be replicated by other emergency and trauma care education partnerships or other graduate professional nursing 23 24 or graduate medical education programs; and 25 (5) includes plans for sustainability of the 26 partnership.

Sec. 61.9805. GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS. In addition to

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- 1 money appropriated by the legislature, the board may solicit,
- 2 accept, and spend grants, gifts, and donations from any public or
- 3 private source for the purposes of this subchapter.
- 4 Sec. 61.9806. RULES. The board shall adopt rules for the
- 5 administration of the Texas emergency and trauma care education
- 6 partnership program. The rules must include:
- 7 (1) provisions relating to applying for a grant under
- 8 this subchapter; and
- 9 (2) standards of accountability consistent with other
- 10 graduate professional nursing and graduate medical education
- 11 programs to be met by any emergency and trauma care education
- 12 partnership awarded a grant under this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9807. ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS. A reasonable amount,
- 14 not to exceed three percent, of any money appropriated for purposes
- 15 of this subchapter may be used to pay the costs of administering
- 16 this subchapter.
- 17 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 18 of this Act, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 19 adopt rules for the implementation and administration of the Texas
- 20 emergency and trauma care education partnership program
- 21 established under Subchapter GG, Chapter 61, Education Code, as
- 22 added by this Act. The board may adopt the initial rules in the
- 23 manner provided by law for emergency rules.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
