- 8 (E) have economic impacts within the state other
- 9 than those specifically described by this subsection; and
- 10 (3) a general statement of the analysis described by
- 11 Subdivision (2) for the remainder of the 20-year period following
- 12 the proposal's effective date.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
