SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 87, Election Code, 15 is 16 amended by adding Section 87.0211 to read as follows: Sec. 87.0211. ELECTRONIC DELIVERY OF MATERIALS RECORDED 17 ELECTRONICALLY. If ballot materials and ballot applications are 18 recorded electronically as provided by Section 87.126, the early 19 voting clerk may deliver those materials to the early voting ballot 20 board through electronic means. 21 SECTION 3. Section 87.027, Election Code, is amended by 22 23 adding Subsection (m) to read as follows:

24 (m) If ballot materials or ballot applications are recorded

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electronically as provided by Section 87.126, the signature 1 verification committee may use an electronic copy of a carrier 2 envelope certificate or the voter's ballot application in making 3 the comparison under Subsection (i). 4 SECTION 4. Subchapter G, Chapter 87, Election Code, 5 is 6 amended by adding Section 87.126 to read as follows: 7 Sec. 87.126. ELECTRONIC RECORDING OF BALLOT MATERIALS AND APPLICATIONS. (a) The early voting clerk may electronically 8 record applications for a ballot to be voted by mail, jacket 9 envelopes, carrier envelopes, and ballots. 10 (b) The secretary of state may adopt rules providing 11 12 requirements for the electronic image quality and storage of the electronic images of the documents described by Subsection (a). 13 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011. 18

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
