A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the authority to lower certain speed limits by local
- 3 governments.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 542, Transportation Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 542.0075 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 542.0075. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS: LOWERING OF SPEED LIMITS
- 8 IN PRIVATE SUBDIVISION. On the request of all of the property owners
- 9 adjacent to a privately maintained road located in a subdivision, a
- 10 commissioners court of a county in which the road is located may set
- 11 and enforce a speed limit of not less than 20 miles per hour on the
- 12 road in the same manner as provided by Section 542.007.
- SECTION 2. Sections 545.356(b-1) and (b-2), Transportation
- 14 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (b-1) The governing body of a municipality, for a highway or
- 16 a part of a highway in the municipality that is not an officially
- 17 designated or marked highway or road of the state highway system,
- 18 may declare a lower speed limit of not less than 20 [25] miles per
- 19 hour, if the governing body determines that the prima facie speed
- 20 limit on the highway is unreasonable or unsafe.
- 21 (b-2) Subsection (b-1) applies only to a one-lane or
- 22 two-lane, undivided highway or part of a highway.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
