- 27 and control of state buildings, grounds, or property, including

- 1 maintenance, construction, purchase, and lease of state buildings,
- 2 grounds, or property, and child care services for state employees
- 3 under Chapter 663, Government Code;
- 4 (2) any obligations and contracts of the Texas
- 5 Facilities Commission that are directly related to implementing a
- 6 power, duty, function, program, or activity transferred under this
- 7 subsection; and
- 8 (3) all property and records in the custody of the
- 9 Texas Facilities Commission that are related to a power, duty,
- 10 function, program, or activity transferred under this subsection
- 11 and all funds appropriated by the legislature for that power, duty,
- 12 function, program, or activity.
- 13 (b) A rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision of the
- 14 Texas Facilities Commission that is related to an activity
- 15 described by Subsection (a) of this section continues in effect as a
- 16 rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision of the State
- 17 Preservation Board until superseded by an act of the State
- 18 Preservation Board.
- 19 (b-1) A rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision of the
- 20 Texas Facilities Commission that relates to a power, duty,
- 21 function, program, or activity transferred under Subsection (a-1)
- 22 of this section is a rule or form of the comptroller of public
- 23 accounts and remains in effect until altered by the comptroller of
- 24 public accounts.
- 25 (b-2) A rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision of the
- 26 Texas Facilities Commission that is related to an activity
- 27 transferred by Subsection (a-2) of this section continues in effect

- 1 as a rule, form, policy, procedure, or decision of the General Land
- 2 Office until superseded by an act of the land commissioner or the
- 3 land commissioner's designee.
- 4 (c) A reference in law to the Texas Facilities Commission
- 5 that relates to a power, duty, function, program, or activity
- 6 transferred under Subsection (a) of this section means the State
- 7 Preservation Board.
- 8 (c-1) A reference in law to the Texas Facilities Commission
- 9 that relates to a power, duty, function, program, or activity
- 10 transferred under Subsection (a-1) of this section means the
- 11 comptroller of public accounts.
- 12 (c-2) A reference in law to the Texas Facilities Commission
- 13 that relates to a power, duty, function, program, or activity
- 14 transferred under Subsection (a-2) of this section means the
- 15 commissioner of the General Land Office.
- 16 (d) A court case, administrative proceeding, contract
- 17 negotiation, or other proceeding involving the Texas Facilities
- 18 Commission that is related to an activity described by Subsection
- 19 (a) of this section is transferred without change in status to the
- 20 State Preservation Board, and the State Preservation Board assumes,
- 21 without a change in status, the position of the Texas Facilities
- 22 Commission in a negotiation or proceeding relating to an activity
- 23 transferred by this Act to the State Preservation Board to which the
- 24 Texas Facilities Commission is a party.
- 25 (d-1) A court case, administrative proceeding, contract
- 26 negotiation, or other proceeding involving the Texas Facilities
- 27 Commission that is related to an activity described by Subsection

- 1 (a-1) of this section is transferred without change in status to the
- 2 comptroller, and the comptroller assumes, without a change in
- 3 status, the position of the Texas Facilities Commission in a
- 4 negotiation or proceeding relating to an activity transferred by
- 5 this Act to the comptroller to which the Texas Facilities
- 6 Commission is a party.
- 7 (d-2) A court case, administrative proceeding, contract
- 8 negotiation, or other proceeding involving the Texas Facilities
- 9 Commission relating to an activity transferred by Subsection (a-2)
- 10 of this section is transferred without change in status to the
- 11 General Land Office, and the General Land Office assumes, without a
- 12 change in status, the position of the Texas Facilities Commission
- 13 in a negotiation or proceeding to which the Texas Facilities
- 14 Commission is a party.
- 15 (e) All money, contracts, leases, rights, bonds, and
- 16 obligations of the Texas Facilities Commission related to an
- 17 activity described by Subsection (a) of this section are
- 18 transferred to the State Preservation Board.
- 19 (e-1) All money, contracts, leases, rights, bonds, and
- 20 obligations of the Texas Facilities Commission related to an
- 21 activity described by Subsection (a-1) of this section are
- 22 transferred to the comptroller.
- 23 (e-2) All money, contracts, leases, rights, bonds, and
- 24 obligations of the Texas Facilities Commission related to an
- 25 activity transferred by Subsection (a-2) of this section are
- 26 transferred to the General Land Office.
- 27 (f) All personal property, including records, in the

- 1 custody of the Texas Facilities Commission related to an activity
- 2 described by Subsection (a) of this section becomes the property of
- 3 the State Preservation Board.
- 4 (f-1) All personal property, including records, in the
- 5 custody of the Texas Facilities Commission related to an activity
- 6 described by Subsection (a-1) of this section becomes the property
- 7 of the comptroller.
- 8 (f-2) All personal property, including records, in the
- 9 custody of the Texas Facilities Commission related to an activity
- 10 transferred by Subsection (a-2) of this section becomes the
- 11 property of the General Land Office.
- 12 (g) All funds appropriated by the legislature to the Texas
- 13 Facilities Commission for an activity described by Subsection (a)
- 14 of this section, including funds for providing administrative
- 15 support for those services, are transferred to the State
- 16 Preservation Board.
- 17 (g-1) All funds appropriated by the legislature to the Texas
- 18 Facilities Commission for an activity described by Subsection (a-1)
- 19 of this section, including funds for providing administrative
- 20 support for those services, are transferred to the comptroller.
- (g-2) All funds appropriated by the legislature to the Texas
- 22 Facilities Commission for an activity transferred by Subsection
- 23 (a-2) of this section are transferred to the General Land Office.
- SECTION 28. The comptroller, the State Preservation Board,
- 25 the General Land Office, and the Texas Facilities Commission shall
- 26 adopt a memorandum of understanding that identifies and allocates
- 27 between the office of the comptroller, the State Preservation

- 1 Board, and the General Land Office the powers, duties, property,
- 2 appropriations, and other items transferred under this Act. The
- 3 memorandum of understanding must also:
- 4 (1) identify and allocate between the office of the
- 5 comptroller, the State Preservation Board, and the General Land
- 6 Office the real and personal property of the Texas Facilities
- 7 Commission, including space in the central administrative offices
- 8 of the commission, used to generally support the activities of the
- 9 Texas Facilities Commission; and
- 10 (2) provide a timetable for any necessary or advisable
- 11 movement of the physical location of property.
- 12 SECTION 29. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
