## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Logan's Law.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 756, Health and Safety Code, is amended
7	by adding Subchapter I to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER I. CULVERTS OR OTHER DRAINAGE SYSTEMS
9	Sec. 756.151. DUTY OF MUNICIPALITY. (a) This section
10	applies only to an intake to a culvert or other enclosed flood or
11	drainage system that is:
12	(1) maintained by a municipality with a population of
13	more than two million; and
14	(2) located within 100 feet of an elementary school.
15	(b) A municipality shall ensure that:
16	(1) each intake described by Subsection (a) is
17	protected by a bar, grate, or other appropriate covering sufficient
18	to ensure that a child may not be swept into the system; and
19	(2) a sign warning of the hazard for a child, including
20	the danger for injury or drowning, is clearly posted at the intake.
21	(c) A municipality shall ensure that each culvert or other
22	enclosed flood or drainage system with an intake that is subject to
23	the requirements of this section has a hinged opening or other type

- 2 SECTION 3. Not later than September 1, 2011, a municipality
- 3 with a population of more than two million shall ensure that each
- 4 culvert or other enclosed flood or drainage system and each intake
- 5 to the system meets the requirements of Section 756.151, Health and
- 6 Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
