## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to tuition and scholarships and fee exemptions for certain
3	members of the armed services and certain military veterans
4	attending institutions of higher education.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 54.203, Education Code, is amended by
7	adding Subsection (a-3) to read as follows:
8	(a-3) Notwithstanding Subsection (a)(4), a person who meets
9	the requirements of Subsection (a)(4), other than the requirement
10	that the person must have served on active military duty for more
11	than the stated number of days, is entitled to the exemption
12	provided by Subsection (a)(4) regardless of the length of the
13	member's active military duty if the person was a member of the
14	Texas National Guard or the Texas Air National Guard who was
15	assigned to a theater of combat operation with the armed forces of
16	the United States.
17	SECTION 2. Chapter 56, Education Code, is amended by adding
18	Subchapter S to read as follows:
19	SUBCHAPTER S. ASSISTANCE FOR TUITION AND FEES FOR MEMBERS
20	OF TEXAS STATE GUARD
21	Sec. 56.501. PURPOSE. Because the Texas State Guard is the
22	state's only organized, trained, and equipped military force under
23	the direction of the governor available to respond to natural and
24	man-made disasters, assistance for tuition and mandatory fees is

provided under this subchapter to eligible members of the Texas 1 2 State Guard to encourage voluntary membership, to improve the 3 education level of its members, to diversify the composition of the forces, and to enhance the state's workforce. 4 5 Sec. 56.502. EXEMPTION. An institution of higher education shall exempt an eligible person from the payment of tuition and 6 7 mandatory fees for the semester credit hours for which the person 8 enrolls, not to exceed a total of 120 semester credit hours. If the person is not charged tuition at the rate provided for other Texas 9 10 residents, the amount of the exemption may not exceed the amount of tuition the person would be charged as a Texas resident for the 11 12 number of semester credit hours for which the person enrolls, not to exceed 120 semester credit hours. 13 Sec. 56.503. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive an 14 15 exemption under this subchapter, a person must: 16 (1) be a member in good standing for at least one 17 calendar year, as certified by the adjutant general, of the Texas State Guard; and 18 19 (2) commit to serve the Texas State Guard as follows: (A) for an undergraduate program, eight years, 20 four years of which must be served while enrolled in an institution 21 22 of higher education and four years of which must be served following 23 the period of enrollment; and 24 (B) for a graduate program, five years, two years of which must be served while enrolled in an institution of higher 25 26 education and three years of which must be served following the perio<u>d of enrollment.</u> 27

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1 Sec. 56.504. REPAYMENT. The Texas Higher Education 2 Coordinating Board by rule shall require a person who does not fulfill the commitment to serve in the Texas State Guard under 3 Section 56.503(2) to repay the amount of all tuition and mandatory 4 fees for which the person received an exemption under this 5 subchapter to the institution of higher education from which the 6 7 person received the exemption. 8 Sec. 56.505. RULES. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall adopt rules as necessary for the 9 administration of this subchapter. 10 SECTION 3. Section 61.9774(b), Education Code, is amended 11 to read as follows: 12 The board by rule shall provide that: 13 (b) 14 (1) any amount paid to a student by a branch of the 15 armed services of the United States during an academic year for which the student receives a scholarship under this subchapter 16 because the student is under a contract with that branch shall be 17 deducted from the amount of the scholarship awarded to the student 18 19 for that academic year; and 20 (2) after a deduction under Subdivision (1) is made, 21 the student is entitled to the remaining amount of the scholarship awarded to the student under this subchapter for that academic 22 year, not to exceed the student's total cost of attendance for that 23 academic year at the public or private institution of higher 24 education in which the student is enrolled. 25 SECTION 4. The following provisions are repealed: 26 (1) Section 54.2155, Education Code; and 27

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(2) Section 431.090, Government Code.

2 SECTION 5. (a) Section 54.203(a-3), Education Code, as 3 added by this Act, applies beginning with tuition and fees at a 4 public institution of higher education for the 2011 fall semester. 5 Tuition and fees for a term or semester before the 2011 fall 6 semester are covered by the law in effect immediately before the 7 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in 8 effect for that purpose.

9 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall 10 adopt rules for the administration of Subchapter S, Chapter 56, 11 Education Code, as added by this Act, and Section 61.9774(b), 12 Education Code, as amended by this Act, as soon as practicable after 13 this Act takes effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may 14 adopt the rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.

15 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
