Section 4101.001(a), Insurance Code, is amended 4 5 to read as follows: 6 (a) In this chapter: (1) "Adjuster" [, "adjuster"] means <u>a person</u> 7 [an individual] who: 8 9 (A) [(1)] investigates or adjusts losses on behalf of an insurer as an independent contractor or as an employee 10 11 of: 12 $\underline{\text{(i)}}$ $\underline{\text{(i)}}$ an adjustment bureau; 13 (ii) [(B)] an association; 14 (iii) [(C)] a general property and casualty agent or personal lines property and casualty agent; 15 16 (iv) [(D)] an independent contractor; (v) [(E)] an insurer; or 17 18 $\underline{\text{(vi)}}$ [$\overline{\text{(F)}}$] a managing general agent; (B) $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$ supervises the handling of claims; or 19 (C) (3) investigates, adjusts, supervises the 20 21 handling of, or settles workers' compensation claims, including claims arising from services provided through a certified workers' 22 compensation health care network as authorized under Chapter 1305, 23 on behalf of an administrator, as defined by Chapter 4151, or on 24

- 26 (2) present evidence satisfactory to the department

3	that permits a resident of this state to act as an adjuster in that

5	(C) has complied with all federal laws relating
6	to employment or the transaction of business in the United States,
7	if the applicant does not reside in the United States;
8	(D) is trustworthy; and
9	(E) has had experience, special education, or
10	training of sufficient duration and extent regarding the handling
11	of loss claims under insurance contracts to make the applicant
12	competent to fulfill the responsibilities of an adjuster; and
13	(3) pass an examination conducted under this
14	subchapter or present evidence that the applicant has been exempted
15	under Section 4101.056.
16	(c) To qualify for a license under this chapter, a business
17	<pre>entity must:</pre>
18	(1) comply with this chapter; and
19	(2) present evidence satisfactory to the department
20	<pre>that the applicant:</pre>
21	(A) is eligible to designate this state as its
22	<pre>home state;</pre>
23	(B) is trustworthy;
24	(C) has designated a licensed adjuster
25	responsible for the business entity's compliance with the insurance
26	<pre>laws of this state;</pre>
27	(D) has not committed an act that is a ground for

- 1 probation, suspension, revocation, or refusal of an adjuster's
- 2 license under Section 4101.201; and
- 3 (E) has paid the fees prescribed under Section
- 4 4101.057.
- 5 (d) An individual who is a resident of Canada may not be
- 6 licensed under this chapter or designate this state as the
- 7 individual's home state unless the individual has successfully
- 8 passed the adjuster examination and complied with the other
- 9 applicable portions of this section, except that the individual is
- 10 not required to comply with Subsection (a)(2)(B) or (C).
- 11 SECTION 4. Section 4101.053, Insurance Code, as amended by
- 12 this Act, applies only to an application for a license filed on or
- 13 after the effective date of this Act. A license application filed
- 14 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 15 applicable to the application immediately before the effective date
- 16 of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 17 purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
