## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to reporting information regarding public school student
- 3 dropout rates.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 7.008, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (c) The procedures developed under this section must
- 9 provide:
- 10 (1) a summarized format easily understood by the
- 11 public for reporting financial and academic performance
- 12 information, including information relating to student dropout
- 13 rates, on the agency Internet website; and
- 14 (2) the ability for those who access the Internet
- 15 website to view and download state, district, and campus level
- 16 information.
- 17 <u>(c-1)</u> For purposes of Subsection (c), the home page of the
- 18 agency's Internet website must include a prominent link to
- 19 information relating to student dropout rates.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter J, Chapter 39, Education Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Section 39.309 to read as follows:
- Sec. 39.309. DROPOUT INFORMATION MAINTAINED ON DISTRICT
- 23 WEBSITE. (a) A school district shall maintain on the home page of
- 24 the district's Internet website a prominent link to a summarized

- 1 format easily understood by the public in which the district posts
- 2 information reported under Section 42.006(c-1) relating to student
- 3 dropout rates.
- 4 (b) This section does not authorize the disclosure of
- 5 student information that may not be disclosed under the Family
- 6 Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section
- 7 1232g). A school district shall comply with rules adopted by the
- 8 commissioner under Section 7.008 to protect the confidentiality of
- 9 student information.
- SECTION 3. Section 42.006, Education Code, is amended by
- 11 adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows:
- 12 (c-1) For purposes of Subsection (c)(1), each school
- 13 district shall report information relating to student dropout rates
- 14 each six-week period during the school year.
- SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012
- 16 school year.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
