5	SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure,	is

- amended by adding Article 2.126 to read as follows: 6
- 7 Art. 2.126. PEACE OFFICERS COMMISSIONED BY THEALABAMA-COUSHATTA INDIAN TRIBE. (a) The tribal council of the 8 Alabama-Coushatta Indian Tribe is authorized to employ and 9
- commission peace officers for the purpose of enforcing state law 10
- within the boundaries of the tribe's reservation. 11
- 12 (b) Within the boundaries of the tribe's reservation, a peace officer commissioned under this article: 13
- (1) is vested with all the powers, privileges, and 14 immunities of peace officers; 15
- 16 (2) may, in accordance with Chapter 14, arrest without a warrant any person who violates a law of the state; and 17
- 18 (3) may enforce all traffic laws on streets and
- 19 highways.
- (c) Outside the boundaries of the tribe's reservation, a 21 peace officer commissioned under this article is vested with all
- the powers, privileges, and immunities of peace officers and may 22
- 23 arrest any person who violates any law of the state if the peace
- 24 officer:

- (1) is summoned by another law enforcement agency to 1 2 provide assistance; or 3 (2) is assisting another law enforcement agency. 4 Any officer assigned to duty and commissioned under this 5 article shall take and file the oath required of peace officers, and 6 shall execute and file a good and sufficient bond in the sum of 7 \$1,000, payable to the governor, with two or more good and sufficient sureties, conditioned that the officer will fairly, 8 impartially, and faithfully perform the duties as may be required 9 of the officer by law. The bond may be sued on from time to time in 10 the name of the person injured until the whole amount is recovered. 11 12 (e) Any person commissioned under this article must: (1) meet the minimum standards required of peace 13 officers by the commission relating to competence, reliability, 14 15 education, training, morality, and physical and mental health; and 16 (2) meet all standards for certification as a peace 17 officer by the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education. 18 (f) A peace officer commissioned under this article is not 19 entitled to state benefits normally provided by the state to a peace 20
