## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

L	AN ACT

- 2 relating to elimination of the requirement that school districts
- 3 and public junior college districts conduct periodic safety and
- 4 security audits of district facilities.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 37.108(a) and (c-2), Education Code,
- 7 are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Each school district or public junior college district
- 9 shall adopt and implement a multihazard emergency operations plan
- 10 for use in the district's facilities. The plan must address
- 11 mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery as defined by the
- 12 commissioner of education or commissioner of higher education in
- 13 conjunction with the governor's office of homeland security. The
- 14 plan must provide for:
- 15 (1) district employee training in responding to an
- 16 emergency;
- 17 (2) if the plan applies to a school district,
- 18 mandatory school drills and exercises to prepare district students
- 19 and employees for responding to an emergency; and
- 20 (3) measures to ensure coordination with the
- 21 Department of State Health Services and local emergency management
- 22 agencies, law enforcement, health departments, and fire
- 23 departments in the event of an emergency[; and
- 24 [(4) the implementation of a safety and security audit

## 1 as required by Subsection (b)].

- 2 (c-2) A document relating to a school district's or public
- 3 junior college district's multihazard emergency operations plan is
- 4 subject to disclosure if the document enables a person to:
- 5 (1) verify that the district has established a plan
- 6 and determine the agencies involved in the development of the plan
- 7 and the agencies coordinating with the district to respond to an
- 8 emergency, including the Department of State Health Services, local
- 9 emergency services agencies, law enforcement agencies, health
- 10 departments, and fire departments;
- 11 (2) verify that the district's plan was reviewed
- 12 within the last 12 months and determine the specific review dates;
- 13 (3) verify that the plan addresses the four phases of
- 14 emergency management under Subsection (a);
- 15 (4) verify that district employees have been trained
- 16 to respond to an emergency and determine the types of training, the
- 17 number of employees trained, and the person conducting the
- 18 training;
- 19 (5) verify that each campus in the district has
- 20 conducted mandatory emergency drills and exercises in accordance
- 21 with the plan and determine the frequency of the drills;
- 22 (6) if the district is a school district, verify that
- 23 the district has established a plan for responding to a train
- 24 derailment if required under Subsection (d);
- 25 (7) [verify that the district has completed a safety
- 26 and security audit under Subsection (b) and determine the date the
- 27 audit was conducted, the person conducting the audit, and the date

- 1 the district presented the results of the audit to the district's
- 2 board of trustees;
- 3  $\left[\frac{(8)}{(8)}\right]$  verify that the district has addressed any
- 4 recommendations by the district's board of trustees for improvement
- 5 of the plan and determine the district's progress within the last 12
- 6 months; and
- 7 (8) [(9)] if the district is a school district, verify
- 8 that the district has established a visitor policy and identify the
- 9 provisions governing access to a district building or other
- 10 district property.
- SECTION 2. Section 37.109(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 (b) The committee shall:
- 14 (1) participate on behalf of the district in
- 15 developing and implementing emergency plans consistent with the
- 16 district multihazard emergency operations plan required by Section
- 17 37.108(a) to ensure that the plans reflect specific campus,
- 18 facility, or support services needs;
- 19 (2) provide the district with any campus, facility, or
- 20 support services information required in connection with a [safety
- 21 and security audit required by Section 37.108(b), a safety and
- 22 security audit report required by Section 37.108(c), or another
- 23 report required to be submitted by the district to the Texas School
- 24 Safety Center; and
- 25 (3) review each report required to be submitted by the
- 26 district to the Texas School Safety Center to ensure that the report
- 27 contains accurate and complete information regarding each campus,

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- 1 facility, or support service in accordance with criteria
- 2 established by the center.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 37.2161(a), Education Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (a) The center shall periodically provide a school safety
- 6 and security progress report to the governor, the legislature, the
- 7 State Board of Education, and the agency that contains current
- 8 information regarding school safety and security in the school
- 9 districts and public junior college districts of this state based
- 10 on:
- 11 (1) elements of each district's multihazard emergency
- 12 operations plan required by Section 37.108(a); and
- 13 (2) [elements of each district's safety and security
- 14 audit required by Section 37.108(b); and
- 15 [(3)] any [other] report required to be submitted to
- 16 the center.
- SECTION 4. Sections 37.108(b), (c), and (c-1), Education
- 18 Code, are repealed.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
