1 AN ACT 2 relating to the disposition of property seized by the Texas Department of Public Safety in connection with violations of the 3 Texas Controlled Substances Act. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Article 59.06, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 6 7 amended by adding Subsection (c-2) to read as follows: (c-2) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), with respect to 8 9 forfeited property seized in connection with a violation of Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code (Texas Controlled Substances Act), by a 10 peace officer employed by the Department of Public Safety, the 11 12 attorney representing the state shall enter into a local agreement with the department that allows the attorney representing the state 13 14 either to: 15 (1) transfer forfeited property to the department to maintain, repair, use, and operate for official purposes in the 16 manner provided by Subsection (b); or 17 18 (2) allocate proceeds from the sale of forfeited property described by Subsection (c), after the deduction of court 19 costs as described by that subsection, in the following 20 21 proportions: 22 (A) 40 percent to a special fund in the 23 department to be used solely for law enforcement purposes; 24 (B) 30 percent to a special fund in the county

No. 2887 treasury for the benefit of the office of the attorney representing 1 2 the state, to be used by the attorney solely for the official purposes of the attorney's office; and 3 4 (C) 30 percent to the general revenue fund. SECTION 2. Article 59.06, Code of Criminal Procedure, as 5 6 amended by this Act, applies to property seized or taken into custody on or after the effective date of this Act. Property seized 7 or taken into custody before the effective date of this Act is 8 governed by the law in effect on the date the property is seized or 9 taken into custody, and the former law is continued in effect for 10 that purpose. 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011. 12
