5	SECTION 1. Section 692A.020, Health and Safety Code, is

8	EDUCATION PROGRAM. (a) The department shall contract with a
9	nonprofit organization to maintain a statewide donor registry, to
10	[In this section, "registry program" means the donor education,
11	awareness, and registry program established under this section and
12	known as the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry.
13	[ <del>(b) Any program or component of a program that the</del>
14	department develops under this chapter shall] be known as the
15	Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry.
16	(b) The nonprofit organization administering the registry
17	must include representatives from each [(c) The department shall
18	affiliate with an entity, such as a national or state association
19	concerned with organ donation, to promote the registry program in
20	accordance with this section.
21	[ <del>(d) In consultation with the Department of Public Safety</del>
22	and] organ procurement organization in this state [organizations,
23	the department shall establish the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas
	Registry].
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1 (c) [(e)] The department shall require the nonprofit organization with which the department has contracted to administer 2 the statewide donor registry to establish and maintain [enter into 3 an agreement with an organization selected by the commissioner 4 5 under a competitive proposal process for the establishment and maintenance of] a statewide Internet-based registry of organ, 6 tissue, and eye donors [. Contingent on the continued availability 7 8 of appropriations under Subsection (k), the term of the initial agreement is two years and may be renewed for two-year terms 9 thereafter unless terminated in a written notice to the other party 10 by the department or organization not later than the 180th day 11 before the last day of a term]. 12

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(d) [(f)] The Department of Public Safety at least monthly 13 14 shall electronically transfer to the nonprofit organization under 15 contract with the department [selected by the commissioner as provided by Subsection (e)] the name, date of birth, driver's 16 17 license number, most recent address, and any other relevant information in the possession of the Department of Public Safety 18 for any person who indicates on the person's driver's license 19 application under Section 521.401, Transportation Code, that the 20 person would like to make an anatomical gift [and consents in 21 writing to the release of the information by the Department of 22 Public Safety to the organization for inclusion in the 23 24 Internet-based registry].

25 (e) [(g)] The contract between the department and the 26 nonprofit organization administering the registry [selected by the 27 commissioner as provided by Subsection (e)] must require the

1 organization to:

2 (1) make information obtained from the Department of
3 Public Safety under Subsection (d) [(f)] available to procurement
4 organizations;

5 (2) allow potential donors to submit information in 6 writing directly to the organization for inclusion in the 7 Internet-based registry;

8 (3) maintain the Internet-based registry in a manner 9 that allows procurement organizations to immediately access organ, 10 tissue, and eye donation information 24 hours a day, seven days a 11 week through electronic and telephonic methods; and

(4) protect the confidentiality and privacy of the
individuals providing information to the Internet-based registry,
regardless of the manner in which the information is provided.

15 (f) [(h)] Except as otherwise provided by Subsection (e)(3)  $\left[\frac{g}{3}\right]$  or this subsection, the Department of Public Safety, the 16 17 nonprofit organization under contract to administer the registry [selected by the commissioner under Subsection (e)], 18 or а 19 procurement organization may not sell, rent, or otherwise share any information provided to the Internet-based registry. A procurement 20 organization may share any information provided to the registry 21 with an organ procurement organization or a health care provider or 22 23 facility providing medical care to a potential donor as necessary 24 to properly identify an individual at the time of donation.

25 (g) [(i)] The Department of Public Safety, the <u>nonprofit</u> 26 organization [<del>selected by the commissioner</del>] under <u>contract with the</u> 27 department to administer the registry [<del>Subsection (e)</del>], or the

1 procurement organizations may not use any demographic or specific 2 data provided to the Internet-based registry for any fund-raising 3 activities. Data may only be transmitted from the selected 4 organization to procurement organizations through electronic and 5 telephonic methods using secure, encrypted technology to preserve 6 the integrity of the data and the privacy of the individuals 7 providing information.

8 (h) [(j)] In each office authorized to issue driver's 9 licenses or personal identification certificates, the Department 10 of Public Safety shall make available educational materials 11 developed by the <u>nonprofit organization administering the registry</u> 12 [Texas Organ, Tissue, and Eye Donor Council established under 13 Chapter 113, as added by Chapter 1186, Acts of the 79th Legislature, 14 Regular Session, 2005].

15 (i) [(k)] The Department of Public Safety shall remit to the comptroller the money collected under Sections 521.421(g) and 16 17 521.422(c), Transportation Code, as provided by those subsections. A county assessor-collector shall remit to the comptroller any 18 19 money collected under Section 502.1745, Transportation Code, as provided by that section. Money remitted to the comptroller in 20 21 accordance with those sections that is appropriated to the 22 department shall be disbursed to the nonprofit organization administering the registry under this section under the terms of 23 24 the contract between the department and the organization [must be spent in accordance with the priorities established by the 25 26 department in consultation with the Texas Organ, Tissue, and Eye Donor Council] to pay the costs of: 27

1 (1) maintaining, operating, and updating the 2 Internet-based registry and establishing procedures for an 3 individual to be added to the registry; [and]

4 (2) designing and distributing educational materials
5 for prospective donors as required under this section; and [-]

6 (3) providing [(1) Any additional money over the 7 amount necessary to accomplish the purposes of Subsections (k)(1) 8 and (2) may be used by the department to provide] education under 9 this chapter [or may be awarded using a competitive grant process to 10 organizations to conduct organ, eye, and tissue donation education 11 activities in this state. A member of the Texas Organ, Tissue, and 12 Eye Donor Council may not receive a grant under this subsection].

13 (j) [(m)] The department shall require the <u>nonprofit</u> 14 organization selected <u>to administer the registry</u> [under Subsection 15 (e)] to submit an annual written report to the department that 16 includes:

17 (1) the number of donors listed on the Internet-based 18 registry;

19 (2) changes in the number of donors listed on the20 registry; [and]

(3) the demographic characteristics of listed donors, to the extent the characteristics may be determined from information provided on donor registry forms submitted by donors to the organization; and

25 (4) an accounting of the use of the money disbursed
 26 under Subsection (i) for the administration of the registry.

27 (k) [(n)] To the extent funds are available and as part of

1 the donor registry program, the department <u>may allocate funds to</u> 2 <u>the nonprofit organization administering the registry pursuant to</u> 3 <u>the contract to</u> [shall] educate residents about anatomical gifts. 4 The <u>education provided under this section</u> [program] shall include 5 information about: 6 (1) the laws governing anatomical gifts, including

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7 Subchapter Q, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, Chapter 693, and 8 this chapter;

9 (2) the procedures for becoming an organ, eye, or 10 tissue donor or donee; and

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(3) the benefits of organ, eye, or tissue donation.

12 (1) [(o)] In <u>contracting for</u> [developing] the registry 13 program, the department [in consultation with the Texas Organ, 14 Tissue, and Eye Donor Council] shall solicit broad-based input 15 reflecting recommendations of all interested groups, including 16 representatives of patients, providers, ethnic groups, and 17 geographic regions.

18 (m) The [(p) In consultation with the Texas Organ, Tissue, 19 and Eye Donor Council, the] department may require the nonprofit 20 organization administering the registry to:

21 (1) implement a training program for all appropriate 22 Department of Public Safety and Texas Department of Transportation 23 employees on the benefits of organ, tissue, and eye donation and the 24 procedures for individuals to be added to the Internet-based 25 registry; and

26 (2) [. The department shall implement the training
 27 program before the date that the registry is operational and shall]

conduct the training <u>described by Subdivision (1)</u> on an ongoing
 basis for new employees.

3 <u>(n)</u> [<del>(q)</del>] The department <u>may require the nonprofit</u> 4 <u>organization administering the registry to</u> [<del>shall</del>] develop a 5 program to educate health care providers and attorneys in this 6 state about anatomical gifts.

7 (o) [(r)] The department [through the program] shall
8 require the nonprofit organization administering the registry to
9 encourage:

10 (1) attorneys to provide organ donation information to 11 clients seeking advice for end-of-life decisions; [-]

12 (2) [(s) The department shall encourage] medical and 13 nursing schools in this state to include mandatory organ donation 14 education in the schools' curricula; and [-]

15 (3) [(t) The department shall encourage] medical 16 schools in this state to require a physician in a neurology or 17 neurosurgery residency program to complete an advanced course in 18 organ donation education.

19 (p) The nonprofit organization administering the registry 20 may not:

21 (1) charge any fee for costs related to the operation 22 and maintenance of the registry, except as agreed in the contract 23 with the department; or

24 (2) use the registry to solicit voluntary donations of
 25 money from a registrant.

26 (q) Except as provided by Subsection (p), the nonprofit
27 organization administering the registry may accept voluntary

1 donations of money and perform fund-raising on behalf of the 2 registry for the purpose of supporting registering donors.

3 SECTION 2. Section 502.1745(b), Transportation Code, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 (b) A county assessor-collector shall collect an additional fee of \$1 for the registration or renewal of registration of a motor 6 vehicle to pay the costs of the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas 7 [Donor Education, Awareness, and] Registry [Program of Texas,] 8 established under Chapter 692A [49], Health and Safety Code, [and 9 of the Texas Organ, Tissue, and Eye Donor Council, established 10 under Chapter 113, Health and Safety Code, ] if the person 11 12 registering or renewing the registration of a motor vehicle opts to pay the additional fee. Notwithstanding any other provision of 13 14 this chapter, the county assessor-collector shall remit all fees 15 collected under this subsection to the comptroller, who shall maintain the identity of the source of the fees. 16

SECTION 3. Section 502.189(a), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The department, with expert input and support from the
 20 nonprofit organization administering the Glenda Dawson Donate
 21 Life-Texas Registry under Chapter 692A, Health and Safety Code
 22 [Texas Organ, Tissue, and Eye Donor Council], shall:

(1) add a link from the department's Internet website
 to the <u>Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas</u> [<del>Donor Education, Awareness,</del>
 and] Registry <u>operated</u> [<del>Program of Texas established</del>] under Chapter
 <u>692A</u> [49], Health and Safety Code; and

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(2) provide a method to distribute donor registry

information to interested individuals in each office authorized to
 issue motor vehicle registrations.

3 SECTION 4. Section 521.148(c), Transportation Code, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 (c) When the department issues a license to which this 6 section applies, the department shall provide the person to whom 7 the license is issued with written information about the Glenda 8 Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry <u>operated</u> [program established] 9 under Chapter 692A [49], Health and Safety Code.

10 SECTION 5. Section 521.401, Transportation Code, is amended 11 by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as 12 follows:

Donor registry information shall be provided to the 13 (C) 14 department and the Texas Department of Transportation by organ procurement organizations, tissue banks, or eye banks, as those 15 terms are defined in Section 692A.002, Health and Safety Code, or by 16 Dawson 17 the Glenda Donate Life-Texas Registry operated [established] under Chapter 692A, Health and Safety Code. 18 The 19 department, with expert input and support from the nonprofit organization administering the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas 20 <u>Registry</u> [Texas Organ, Tissue, and Eye Donor Council], shall: 21

(1) provide to each applicant for the issuance of an
original, renewal, corrected, or duplicate driver's license or
personal identification certificate who applies in person, by mail,
over the Internet, or by other electronic means:

(A) the opportunity to indicate on the person'sdriver's license or personal identification certificate that the

SECTION 6. Section 521.402(c), Transportation Code, 27 is

To have a person's name deleted from the statewide 2 (c) 3 Internet-based registry of organ, tissue, and eye donors maintained as provided by Chapter 692A [49], Health and Safety Code, a person 4 must provide written notice to the nonprofit organization selected 5 [by the commissioner of state health services] under that chapter 6 to maintain the registry directing the deletion of the person's 7 8 name from the registry. On receipt of a written notice under this subsection, the organization shall promptly remove the person's 9 10 name and information from the registry.

SECTION 7. Section 521.421(g), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

The department shall collect an additional fee of \$1 for 13 (g) 14 the issuance or renewal of a license, including a duplicate 15 license, a license issued to reflect an additional authorization or a change in classification, or a license issued or renewed over the 16 17 Internet or by other electronic means, to pay the costs of the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas [Donor Education, Awareness, and] 18 Registry operated [Program of Texas, established] under Chapter 19 692A [49], Health and Safety Code, [and, subject to Section 20 113.104, Health and Safety Code, of the Texas Organ, Tissue, and Eye 21 Donor Council, established under Chapter 113, Health and Safety 22 23 Code, ] if the person applying for, renewing, or changing a license 24 opts to pay the additional fee. The department shall remit fees collected under this subsection to the comptroller, who shall 25 26 maintain the identity of the source of the fees. Subject to appropriation, the department may retain three percent of the money 27

collected under this subsection to cover the costs in administering
 this subsection.

3 SECTION 8. Section 521.422(c), Transportation Code, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 (c) The department shall collect an additional fee of \$1 for the issuance or renewal of a personal identification card, 6 including a duplicate personal identification card or a personal 7 identification card issued or renewed over the Internet or by other 8 electronic means, to pay the costs of the Glenda Dawson Donate 9 10 Life-Texas [Donor Education, Awareness, and] Registry [Program of Texas, ] established under Chapter 692A [49], Health and Safety 11 Code, [and, subject to Section 113.104, Health and Safety Code, of 12 the Texas Organ, Tissue, and Eye Donor Council, established under 13 14 Chapter 113, Health and Safety Code, ] if the person applying for or 15 renewing a personal identification card opts to pay the additional fee. The department shall remit fees collected under this 16 17 subsection to the comptroller, who shall maintain the identity of the source of the fees. Subject to appropriation, the department 18 may retain three percent of the money collected under this 19 subsection to cover the costs in administering this subsection. 20

21 SECTION 9. Section 522.034(c), Transportation Code, is 22 amended to read as follows:

(c) When the department issues a license or permit to which this section applies, the department shall provide the person to whom the license is issued with written information about the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry program established under Chapter 692A [49], Health and Safety Code.

1 SECTION 10. (a) Chapter 113, Health and Safety Code, is 2 repealed.

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3 (b) Section 49.002(m), Health and Safety Code, as amended by
4 Chapter 831 (S.B. 1803), Acts of the 81st Legislature, Regular
5 Session, 2009, is repealed.

6 SECTION 11. (a) Not later than January 1, 2012, the 7 Department of State Health Services shall enter into a contract 8 with a nonprofit organization to administer the Glenda Dawson 9 Donate Life-Texas Registry under Section 692A.020, Health and 10 Safety Code, as amended by this Act.

(4) all money, contracts, leases, rights, and

transferred to the Department of State Health Services;

(5) the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry, as
established by Section 692A.020, Health and Safety Code, as it
existed immediately before January 1, 2012, is abolished;

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(6) all property in the custody of any organization selected under Section 692A.020(e), Health and Safety Code, as that 2 3 section existed immediately before January 1, 2012, in relation to the operation of the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry is 4 transferred to the Department of State Health Services; 5

(7) the unexpended and unobligated balance of any 6 7 money attributable to voluntary fees collected under Section 8 502.1745, 521.421(g), or 521.422(c), Transportation Code, for the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry as it existed immediately 9 10 before January 1, 2012, may be used by the Department of State Health Services for contracts relating to the Glenda Dawson Donate 11 Life-Texas Registry under Section 692A.020, Health and Safety Code, 12 13 as amended by this Act; and

the Department of State Health Services shall 14 (8) 15 transfer all information formerly maintained by the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry, as it existed immediately before 16 17 January 1, 2012, to the nonprofit organization administering the Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry under Section 692A.020, 18 Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, for use in the 19 Glenda Dawson Donate Life-Texas Registry created by Section 20 692A.020, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act. 21

SECTION 12. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2011. 23

24 (b) The following provisions take effect January 1, 2012: 25 Section 692A.020, Health and Safety Code, as (1)26 amended by this Act; and

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Sections 502.1745, 502.189, 521.148, 521.401, (2)

521.402, 521.421, 521.422, and 522.034, Transportation Code, as
 amended by this Act.
