## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 5 SECTION 1. Section 12.151, Business Organizations Code, is

- 8 AND RECORDS AND MAKE CERTAIN INQUIRIES. (a) Each filing entity and
- 9 foreign filing entity shall permit the attorney general to inspect,
- 10 examine, and make copies, as the attorney general considers
- 11 necessary in the performance of a power or duty of the attorney
- 12 general, of any record of the entity. A record of the entity
- 13 includes minutes and a book, account, letter, memorandum,
- 14 <u>electronic transmission</u>, document, check, voucher, telegram,
- 15 constitution, and bylaw.
- 16 (b) If the attorney general has reason to believe that a
- 17 nonprofit entity with a charitable purpose is engaging in, has
- 18 engaged in, or is about to engage in an unlawful act or practice or

- 12 SECTION 3. Chapter 123, Property Code, is amended by adding
- 13 Section 123.007 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 123.007. AUTHORITY OF ATTORNEY GENERAL TO EXAMINE
- 15 BOOKS AND RECORDS AND MAKE CERTAIN INQUIRIES. (a) Each charitable
- 16 entity or fiduciary or managerial agent of a charitable trust shall
- 17 permit the attorney general to inspect, examine, and make copies,
- 18 as the attorney general considers necessary in the performance of a
- 19 power or duty of the attorney general with respect to charitable
- 20 entities and trusts, of any record of the charitable entity or
- 21 trust. A record of the charitable entity or trust includes minutes
- 22 and a book, account, letter, memorandum, electronic transmission,
- 23 document, check, voucher, telegram, constitution, and bylaw.
- (b) If the attorney general has reason to believe that a
- 25 person is engaging in, has engaged in, or is about to engage in an
- 26 unlawful act or practice with respect to a charitable trust or that
- 27 it would be in the public interest to conduct an investigation to

- 1 ascertain whether the person is engaging in, has engaged in, or is
- 2 about to engage in an unlawful act or practice with respect to a
- 3 charitable trust, the attorney general may:
- 4 (1) require the person to file on forms prescribed by
- 5 the attorney general a statement or report in writing, under oath or
- 6 otherwise, as to all the facts and circumstances concerning the
- 7 <u>alleged unlawful act or practice and other data and information as</u>
- 8 the attorney general considers necessary; and
- 9 (2) examine under oath any person in connection with
- 10 the alleged unlawful act or practice.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
