Section 1365.003, Insurance Code, is amended by 8 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as 9 follows: 10 11 (a) A group health benefit plan issuer shall offer and make 12 available under the plan coverage for the necessary care and treatment of loss or impairment of speech, language, or hearing for 13 14 a covered individual, including a person covered as a dependent under the plan. 15 16 (c) A coverage or premium quotation for the purchase or renewal of a group contract must include an offer of coverage 17 described by Subsection (a). 18 SECTION 3. Chapter 1365, Insurance Code, is amended by 19 20 adding Section 1365.005 to read as follows: 21 Sec. 1365.005. COVERAGE REQUIRED. (a) A group health benefit plan issuer shall provide coverage under the plan for the 22 23 necessary care and treatment of loss or impairment of speech, language, or hearing for a person covered as a dependent child under 24

| 11 | January 1, 2012, is governed by the law as it existed immediately    |
| 12 | before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in  |

13 effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
