7	amended by adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:
8	(j) A communication or record that contains identifying
9	information regarding a person who receives a forensic medical
10	examination under this article and that is created by, provided to,
11	or in the control or possession of the department is confidential
12	for purposes of Section 552.101, Government Code. In this
13	subsection, "identifying information" includes:
14	(1) information revealing the identity, personal
15	history, or background of the person; or
16	(2) information concerning the victimization of the
17	person.
18	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
19	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
20	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
21	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
22	Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
