A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the treatment of tick-borne diseases.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 164, Occupations Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 164.0511 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 164.0511. TREATMENT OF TICK-BORNE DISEASE;
7	DISCIPLINARY ACTION PROHIBITED. (a) The board may not investigate
8	or discipline a physician based solely on the physician's treatment
9	of a patient's tick-borne disease if the physician has:
10	(1) personally performed, in good faith, a medical
11	examination of the patient;
12	(2) informed the patient in writing of the patient's
13	treatment options and the known risks of each option; and
14	(3) obtained informed written consent for the
15	treatment option chosen by the patient.
16	(b) This section may not be construed as prohibiting the
17	board from:
18	(1) investigating a complaint concerning a physician's
19	compliance with Subsection (a) in the treatment of a patient's
20	tick-borne disease; or
21	(2) disciplining a physician who:
22	(A) prescribes, administers, or dispenses a
23	treatment therapy that is not supported by a school of medicine or
24	thought;

1	(B) fails to monitor the ongoing care of a
2	<pre>patient receiving a treatment; or</pre>
3	(C) fails to keep complete and accurate records
4	of the diagnosis and treatment of a patient receiving a treatment.
5	SECTION 2. Subchapter J, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 301.4522 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 301.4522. TREATMENT OF TICK-BORNE DISEASE;
8	DISCIPLINARY ACTION PROHIBITED. (a) The board may not investigate
9	or discipline a nurse based solely on the nurse's treatment of a
10	patient's tick-borne disease if the nurse has:
11	(1) personally performed, in good faith, a medical
12	examination of the patient;
13	(2) informed the patient in writing of the patient's
14	treatment options and the known risks of each option; and
15	(3) obtained informed written consent for the
16	treatment option chosen by the patient.
17	(b) This section may not be construed as prohibiting the
18	board from:
19	(1) investigating a complaint concerning a nurse's
20	compliance with Subsection (a) in the treatment of a patient's
21	tick-borne disease; or
22	(2) disciplining a nurse who:
23	(A) prescribes, administers, or dispenses a
24	treatment therapy that is not supported by a school of medicine or
25	thought;
26	(B) fails to monitor the ongoing care of a

- 3 SECTION 3. Sections 164.0511 and 301.4522, Occupations
- 4 Code, as added by this Act, apply only to the investigation of a
- 5 complaint or a disciplinary action based on a complaint filed on or
- 6 after the effective date of this Act. The investigation of a
- 7 complaint or a disciplinary action based on a complaint filed
- 8 before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 9 complaint was filed, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 10 purpose.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
