17	microenterprise support program to provide financial assistance to		
18	microenterprises in urban areas that are primarily engaged in:		
19	(1) research into processes and technology related to		
20	agricultural production in an urban setting;		
21	(2) the production or development of tools or		
22	processes for agriculture in a manner suited for an urban setting;

- 6 program supporting established and proposed urban farm
- 7 microenterprises in urban areas by providing loans to expand,
