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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Title 3, Agriculture Code, is amended by adding 6 Chapter 44A to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 44A. URBAN FARM MICROENTERPRISE SUPPORT PROGRAM
- 8 Sec. 44A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 9 (1) "Board" means the board of directors of the Texas

 10 Agricultural Finance Authority.
- 11 (2) "Microenterprise" means a small business in which
- 12 the owner operates the enterprise.
- 13 (3) "Urban area" means an area inside the boundaries
 14 of a municipality with a population of 500,000 or more.
- 15 Sec. 44A.002. CREATION OF URBAN FARM MICROENTERPRISE
- 16 SUPPORT PROGRAM. (a) The board shall create an urban farm
- 17 microenterprise support program to provide financial assistance to
- 18 microenterprises in urban areas that are primarily engaged in:
- 19 <u>(1)</u> research into processes and technology related to
- 20 <u>agricultural production in an urban setting;</u>
- 21 (2) the production or development of tools or
- 22 processes for agriculture in a manner suited for an urban setting;
- 23 or

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24 (3) agricultural activities in a manner suited for an

- 1 urban setting.
- 2 (b) No state money may be used for purposes of the program.
- 3 Sec. 44A.003. URBAN FARM MICROENTERPRISE SUPPORT PROGRAM
- 4 LOANS. (a) On the receipt of gifts and grants of money under
- 5 Section 44A.004, the board shall establish and implement a loan
- 6 program supporting established and proposed urban farm
- 7 microenterprises in urban areas by providing loans to expand,
- 8 modernize, or otherwise improve the established microenterprises
- 9 and to begin operation of proposed microenterprises.
- 10 (b) An applicant applying on behalf of a proposed
- 11 microenterprise may receive a loan of up to \$25,000 to begin
- 12 operation of the microenterprise.
- 13 (c) An applicant applying on behalf of an established
- 14 microenterprise may receive a loan of up to \$50,000 to expand,
- 15 modernize, or otherwise improve an established microenterprise.
- 16 (d) The board may reserve a portion of the total fund for use
- 17 in cooperative loan programs established with the participation of
- 18 other public or private lenders.
- 19 (e) The board by rule may provide for the administration by
- 20 a private or public entity of the loans awarded under the loan
- 21 program.
- Sec. 44A.004. MONEY FOR LOANS. The board may accept gifts
- 23 and grants of money from the federal government, local governments,
- 24 or private corporations or other persons for use in making loans
- 25 under the urban farm microenterprise support program.
- Sec. 44A.005. URBAN FARM MICROENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT FUND.
- 27 The urban farm microenterprise development fund is a fund in the

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- 1 comptroller's office. The following shall be deposited to the
- 2 credit of the fund:
- 3 (1) amounts received by the state for loans made under
- 4 the urban farm microenterprise support program;
- 5 (2) money received in repayment of loans made under
- 6 the program; and
- 7 (3) other money received by the board for the program
- 8 and required by the board to be deposited in the fund.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
