H.B. No. 3007

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to eliminating the requirement that a school district assess the physical fitness of students. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 38, Education Code, 5 is repealed. 6 7 SECTION 2. Section 28.004(k), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 8 A school district shall publish in the student handbook 9 (k) and post on the district's Internet website, if the district has an 10 11 Internet website: 12 (1) a statement of the policies adopted to ensure that elementary school, middle school, and junior high school students 13 engage in at least the amount and level of physical activity 14 required by Section 28.002(1); and 15 16 (2) a statement of: (A) the number of times during the preceding year 17 the district's school health advisory council has met; 18 (B) whether the district has adopted and enforces 19 policies to ensure that district campuses comply with agency 20 21 vending machine and food service guidelines for restricting student access to vending machines; and 22 (C) whether the district has adopted and enforces 23 24 policies and procedures that prescribe penalties for the use of

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1 tobacco products by students and others on school campuses or at 2 school-sponsored or school-related activities[; and

3 [(3) a statement providing notice to parents that they
4 can request in writing their child's physical fitness assessment
5 results at the end of the school year].

6 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012 7 school year.

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
