- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 505.003, Business & Commerce Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 505.003. RETENTION OR USE OF ZIP CODE AFTER
- 9 TRANSACTION COMPLETED PROHIBITED; CIVIL PENALTY AND INJUNCTIVE
- 10 RELIEF. (a) A business that obtains a customer's zip code under
- 11 Section 505.002 may not, after the purchase of the good or service
- 12 <u>has been completed:</u>
- 13 <u>(1)</u> retain the zip code in any form; or
- 14 (2) use or cause the zip code to be used for any
- 15 purpose, without regard to whether the zip code is linked or not
- 16 linked to the identity of the customer [after the purchase of the
- 17 good or service has been completed].
- 18 (b) A business that violates this section is liable for a
- 19 civil penalty in an amount of not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000
- 20 for each act of violation.
- 21 (c) A person injured or threatened with injury by a
- 22 <u>violation of this section may seek injunctive relief against the</u>
- 23 business committing or threatening to commit the violation.
- 24 (d) A person injured or threatened with injury by a

- 1 violation of this section includes a person whose zip code is
- 2 retained or used for any purpose by a business in violation of this
- 3 <u>section</u>.
- 4 (e) The attorney general or a county or district attorney
- 5 may bring an action in the name of the state for a civil penalty,
- 6 injunctive relief, or both under this section.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 505.003, Business & Commerce Code, as
- 8 amended by this Act, applies only to a zip code obtained by a
- 9 business on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
