## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of textbook loan programs at public
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 51.976 to read as follows:

institutions of higher education in this state.

- 7 Sec. 51.976. TEXTBOOK LOAN PROGRAM. (a) In this section,
- 8 <u>"general academic teaching institution," "governing board,"</u>
- 9 "institution of higher education," "public junior college,"
- 10 "public state college," and "public technical institute" have the
- 11 meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
- (b) Subject to Subsection (j), the governing board of each
- 13 <u>institution of higher education shall establish a textbook loan</u>
- 14 program for the benefit of students enrolled in each degree or
- 15 certificate program offered by the institution.
- 16 (c) In establishing the program, the governing board of the
- 17 institution shall:
- 18 (1) adopt appropriate procedures and policies for the
- 19 program;

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- 20 (2) coordinate those procedures and policies with
- 21 other institutions of higher education to identify best prices and
- 22 practices for purchasing or otherwise obtaining the textbooks
- 23 required for courses offered by the institution;
- 24 (3) accept bids from textbook publishers for the

- 1 purpose of purchasing the required textbooks directly from those
- 2 publishers;
- 3 (4) to cover the costs of administering the program
- 4 and building and maintaining an appropriate stock of textbooks,
- 5 establish within the institution a textbook loan fund that is
- 6 composed of student charges imposed under Subsection (f) and gifts
- 7 and grants accepted under Subsection (i); and
- 8 (5) create a task force to recommend program
- 9 procedures and policies to the governing board.
- 10 (d) A task force created under Subsection (c)(5) may include
- 11 students, faculty, administrators, and campus bookstore
- 12 representatives.
- 13 (e) A textbook loan program may not limit the authority of
- 14 faculty members to select appropriate instructional materials in
- 15 <u>accordance with the institution's other policies and procedures.</u>
- 16 (f) To cover the costs of administering the program and
- 17 building and maintaining an appropriate stock of textbooks, the
- 18 institution may impose the following charges on students enrolled
- 19 at the institution:
- 20 (1) a textbook program fee imposed on each student in
- 21 the following amounts:
- 22 (A) \$500 on the student's initial enrollment in
- 23 <u>an undergraduate degree or certificate program at a general</u>
- 24 academic teaching institution other than a public state college,
- 25 including enrollment by a transfer or returning student except as
- 26 described by Subsection (g); and
- 27 (B) \$300 on the student's initial enrollment at a

- 1 public junior college, public state college, or public technical
- 2 institute, or in a graduate or professional degree program at an
- 3 institution of higher education, including enrollment by a transfer
- 4 or returning student except as described by Subsection (g); and
- 5 (2) fines in amounts established by the institution
- 6 for any late, lost, or damaged textbook that was loaned to a student
- 7 through the program.
- 8 (f-1) Not later than October 1, 2011, each student who is
- 9 enrolled in an institution of higher education for the 2011 fall
- 10 semester shall pay the one-time textbook program fee in the
- 11 applicable amount described by Subsection (f), except that the
- 12 institution shall waive the fee for a student in the final year of
- 13 the student's degree or certificate program who demonstrates that
- 14 the cost of the student's required textbooks for that academic year
- 15 <u>is likely to be less than the fee that would otherwise be imposed on</u>
- 16 that student under Subsection (f). This subsection expires
- 17 September 1, 2014.
- 18 (g) An institution of higher education shall indicate on the
- 19 student's transcript the student's payment of a textbook program
- 20 fee under Subsection (f). A transfer student or a returning student
- 21 <u>is not required to pay the applicable fee described by Subsection</u>
- 22 (f)(1)(A) or (B) if the student's transcript from any institution
- 23 of higher education reflects an earlier payment of that same fee and
- 24 the student enrolls at an institution of higher education in the
- 25 same level of degree or certificate program as the level of degree
- or certificate program for which the student paid the earlier fee.
- 27 (h) On request by the institution and a showing of just

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- 1 cause for the proposed change, the Texas Higher Education
- 2 Coordinating Board may adjust for the institution any charge
- 3 required to be imposed under Subsection (f).
- 4 (i) The governing board may solicit and accept gifts and
- 5 grants from any public or private source for purposes of the
- 6 program.
- 7 (j) The governing board of an institution is not required to
- 8 <u>establish a textbook loan program if existing contracts or other</u>
- 9 established arrangements with entities operating campus bookstores
- 10 do not permit the program or cannot be amended, canceled, or renewed
- 11 to accommodate the program.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
