## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to certification required to teach public school elective
- 3 courses on the Old and New Testaments and to students offered those
- 4 courses.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 28.011(a) and (f), Education Code, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A school district may offer to students in grade nine or
- 9 above and to students at any district middle or junior high school
- 10 that offers elective courses:
- 11 (1) an elective course on the Hebrew Scriptures (Old
- 12 Testament) and its impact and an elective course on the New
- 13 Testament and its impact; or
- 14 (2) an elective course that combines the courses
- 15 described by Subdivision (1).
- 16 (f) A teacher of a course offered under this section must
- 17 hold a certificate that qualifies the teacher to teach at the grade
- 18 <u>level at which the course is offered regardless of the content or</u>
- 19 subject area the certificate qualifies the teacher to teach
- 20 [minimum of a High School Composite Certification in language arts,
- 21 social studies, or history with, where practical, a minor in
- 22 religion or biblical studies]. A teacher selected to teach a course
- 23 under this section shall successfully complete staff development
- 24 training outlined in Section 21.459. A course under this section

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- 1 may  $[\frac{\text{only}}{\text{only}}]$  be taught  $\frac{\text{only}}{\text{only}}$  by a teacher who has successfully
- 2 completed training under Section 21.459.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012
- 4 school year.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
