2	relating to unauthorized recordings of a live performance.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 641.001, Business & Commerce Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	Sec 641.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
7	(1) "Fix" means to embody in a recording or other
8	tangible medium of expression, by or under the authority of the
9	author, so that the matter embodied is sufficiently permanent or
10	stable to permit it to be perceived, reproduced, or otherwise
11	communicated for a period of more than transitory duration.
12	(2) "Live performance" means a recitation, rendering,
13	or playing of a series, in an audible sequence, of:
14	(A) images;
15	(B) musical, spoken, or other sounds; or
16	(C) a combination of images and sounds.
17	(3) "Owner" means a person who owns the sounds fixed in
18	a master phonograph record, master disc, master tape, master film,
19	or other recording:
20	(A) on which sound is recorded; and
21	(B) from which the transferred recorded sounds
22	are directly or indirectly derived.
23	(3) (4) "Recording" means a tangible medium on which
24	sounds, images, or both are recorded or otherwise stored,

1 including: 2 (A) an original phonograph record, disc, tape, 3 audio or video cassette, wire, film, electronic storage device, or other medium now existing or later developed; or 4 5 (B) a copy or reproduction that wholly or partly 6 duplicates the original. SECTION 2. Chapter 641.001 Business & Commerce Code, is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 9 Sec. 641.052. UNAUTHORIZED RECORDING OF LIVE PERFORMANCE. 10 (a) <u>In this section:</u> (1) "Artist" means a person who contacts to perform or 11 12 entertain at a live entertainment event. (2) "Live entertainment event" means an event that 13 14 occurs on a specific date and at which: 15 (A) an individual or a group of individuals, physically present at the venue, performs and or rehearses for the 16 17 purpose of entertaining a person who is present at the event. (B) a traveling circus or animal show performs 18 19 for the purpose of entertaining a person who is present at the 20 event; or 21 (C) a historical, museum-quality artifact is on 22 display at an exhibition. (3) "Live Performance" means a recitation, rendering, 23 24 or playing of a series, in an audible sequence, of 25 (A) images;

(B) musical, spoken or other sounds; or

(C) a combination of images and sounds.

- 1 (4) "Promoter" means an individual contacted by an
- 2 artist to promote, organize, coordinate, operate, and manage a live
- 3 entertainment event. The term includes services related to:
- 4 (A) the provision of staff for the live
- 5 entertainment event; or
- 6 (B) the schedule and promotion of an artist
- 7 performing or entertaining at the live entertainment event.
- 8 (b) A person commits an offense if the person, with the
- 9 knowledge that a live performance has been recorded or fixed
- 10 without the consent of the owner:
- 11 (1) for commercial advantage or private financial
- 12 gain, advertises, offers for sale, sells, rents, or transports,
- 13 causes the sale, resale, rental, or transportation of, or possesses
- 14 for one or more of these purposes a recording containing sounds of
- 15 the live performance; or
- 16 (2) with the intent to sell for commercial advantage
- 17 or private financial gain, records or fixes the live performance,
- 18 or causes the live performance to be recorded or fixed on a
- 19 recording.
- 20 (c) (b) An offense under this section is punishable by:
- 21 (1) imprisonment for a term of not more than five
- 22 years, not to exceed \$250,000, or both, if:
- (A) the offense involves at least 1,000
- 24 unauthorized recordings embodying sound or at least 65 unauthorized
- 25 audiovisual recordings during a 180-day period; or
- 26 (B) the defendant has been previously convicted
- 27 under this section;

- 1 (2) imprisonment for a term of not more than two years,
- 2 a fine not to exceed \$250,000, or both, if the offense involves more
- 3 than 100 but fewer than 1,000 unauthorized recordings embodying
- 4 sound or more than seven but fewer than 65 unauthorized audiovisual
- 5 recordings during a 180-day period; or
- 6 (3) confinement in the county jail for a term of not
- 7 more than one year, a fine not to exceed \$25,000, or both, if the
- 8 offense is not otherwise punishable under Subdivision (1) or (2).
- 9 <u>(c)</u> (d) A promoter and an artist are mandated pursuant to
- 10 this chapter, regarding a contract for the artist's performance at
- 11 <u>a live entertainment event to:</u>
- 12 (1) distribute any recording revenue and event
- 13 proceeds, in the form of a payments to each other as contractually
- 14 stipulated; and
- 15 (2) agree to and secure permission for the recording
- 16 of the live entertainment event in writing before the event is
- 17 recorded.
- 18 $\frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{(f)}}$ In the absence of a written agreement or law to the
- 19 contrary, the performer or performers of a live performance are
- 20 presumed to own the rights to record or fix those sounds.
- 21 <u>(g)</u> For purposes of this section, a person authorized to
- 22 maintain custody and control over business records that reflect
- 23 whether the owner of a live performance consented to having the live
- 24 performance recorded or fixed is a proper witness in a proceeding
- 25 regarding the issue of consent. A witness called under this
- 26 subsection is subject to the rules of evidence relating to the
- 27 competency of a witness to testify and the relevance and

- 1 admissibility of the testimony offered.
- 2 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 3 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 4 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 5 governed by the law in effect at the time of the offense was
- 6 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 7 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 8 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 9 occurred before that date.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
