A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 Relating to the free admission to state parks for the parents of 3 deceased members of the armed services BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Amend Chapter 13.018, Parks and Wildlife Code, as follows: 6 Sec. 13.018. STATE PARKLANDS PASSPORT. (a) The following 7 people may apply to the department for a state parklands passport: 8 (1) a resident of this state who is 65 years old or 9 over who has resided in the state for six consecutive months 10 11 preceding the date of application for a parklands passport, a 12 member of the United States armed forces on active duty who is 65 years old or over, or any other individual in a category that the 13 14 commission by rule designates as a resident of this state who is 65 years old or over; 15 (2) a veteran of the armed services of the United 16 States who, as a result of military service, 17 has a 18 service-connected disability, as defined by the Veterans' Administration, consisting of the loss of the use of a lower 19 20 extremity or of a 60 percent disability rating and who is receiving 21 compensation from the United States because of the disability; and 22 (3) an individual who has a physical or mental 23 impairment activities of the individual- ; and 24 (4) parents of deceased members of the United States

1 Armed Forces, who have fallen in combat.

2 (b) The department shall issue a passport to each qualified 3 applicant. The passport shall be issued on a form designed and 4 provided by the department.

5 (c) The holder of a state parklands passport issued on or before August 31, 1995, a person whose birth date is before 6 September 1, 1930, or a veteran described by Subsection (a)(2) is 7 8 entitled to enter any state park without payment of an entrance or admission fee. When a fee is charged by the department for entrance 9 10 of a vehicle into a state park, the vehicle of the holder of a state parklands passport is exempt from the fee when the holder is 11 12 present.

The department may discount or waive a park entrance fee 13 (d) 14 for a resident of this state issued an initial state parklands 15 passport after August 31, 1995. When a fee is charged by the department for entrance of a vehicle into a state park, the vehicle 16 17 of the holder of an initial state parklands passport may enter any state park on payment of a lower vehicle entrance fee. 18 The 19 department may waive vehicle entrance fees for any state park for the holder of an initial state parklands passport. 20

(e) The commission by rule shall establish eligibility requirements and privileges available to the holder of a state parklands passport described by Subsection (a)(3).

(f) The department shall waive a park entrance fee and any
vehicle admission fee for the holder of state parklands passport
described by subsection (a)(4).

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
