A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the documentary fee charged in retail installment

- 3 transactions for the sale of certain vehicles.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 345.251, Finance Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a), (b), and (c) and adding Subsections (e),
- 7 (f), (g), (h), (i), and (j) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A retail seller may charge a documentary fee for
- 9 services rendered to, for, or on behalf of a retail buyer in
- 10 [$\frac{preparing_{\tau}}{r}$] handling[$\frac{1}{\tau}$] and processing documents relating to the
- 11 <u>sale under[, and closing</u>] a retail installment transaction <u>of</u>
- 12 [involving,] a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, moped, all-terrain
- 13 vehicle, boat, boat motor, boat trailer, or towable recreational
- 14 vehicle.
- 15 (b) If a documentary fee is charged under this section the
- 16 fee:
- 17 (1) must be charged to cash buyers and credit buyers;
- 18 (2) may not exceed <u>a reasonable amount</u> [\$50]; and
- 19 (3) must be disclosed on the retail installment
- 20 contract as a separate itemized charge.
- 21 (c) A preliminary work sheet on which a sale price is
- 22 computed and that is shown to the retail buyer, an order from the
- 23 buyer, or a retail installment contract must include in reasonable
- 24 proximity to the place on the document where the documentary fee is

1 disclosed:

- 2 (1) the amount of the fee; and
- 3 (2) the following notice in type that is $\underline{boldfaced}$
- 4 [bold-faced], capitalized, or underlined or otherwise
- 5 conspicuously set out from the surrounding written material:
- 6 "A DOCUMENTARY FEE IS NOT AN OFFICIAL FEE. A
- 7 DOCUMENTARY FEE IS NOT REQUIRED BY LAW, BUT MAY BE
- 8 CHARGED TO BUYERS FOR HANDLING DOCUMENTS AND
- 9 PERFORMING SERVICES RELATING TO THE CLOSING OF A SALE.
- A DOCUMENTARY FEE MAY NOT EXCEED A REASONABLE AMOUNT
- 11 [\$50]. THIS NOTICE IS REQUIRED BY LAW."
- 12 (e) A retail seller shall post the notice prescribed in
- 13 Subsection (c) in a prominent place at the location where a vehicle
- 14 sale is finalized.
- (f) Prior to increasing the maximum amount of the
- 16 documentary fee the retail seller charges, a retail seller shall
- 17 provide written notice to the commissioner of the maximum amount of
- 18 the documentary fee the retail seller intends to charge. The
- 19 commissioner may review the amount of a documentary fee for
- 20 reasonableness. In determining whether a fee charged by a retail
- 21 <u>seller is reasonable, the commissioner may consider the resources</u>
- 22 required by the retail seller to perform the retail seller's duties
- 23 under state and federal law with respect to the handling and
- 24 processing of documents relating to the sale and financing of a
- 25 <u>vehicle described under Subsection (a). If the commissioner</u>
- 26 determines that a documentary fee charged is not reasonable, the
- 27 commissioner may require that the documentary fee charged be

- 1 reduced or suspended.
- 2 <u>(g) A documentary fee charged in accordance with this</u>
- 3 <u>section before September 1, 2011, is considered reasonable for</u>
- 4 purposes of this section.
- 5 (h) This section does not:
- 6 (1) create a private right of action; or
- 7 (2) require that the commissioner approve a specific
- 8 documentary fee amount before a retail seller charges the fee.
- 9 (i) The finance commission may adopt rules, including rules
- 10 relating to the standards for a reasonableness determination or
- 11 disclosures, necessary to enforce this section. A rule adopted
- 12 under this subsection may not require a retail seller to submit to
- 13 the commissioner for prior approval the amount of a documentary fee
- 14 that the retail seller intends to charge under this section.
- 15 (j) The commissioner has exclusive jurisdiction to enforce
- 16 this section.
- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
