H.B. No. 3263

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to higher education curriculum review teams to review public school curriculum standards for college readiness purposes. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is 5 amended by adding Section 28.0024 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 28.0024. HIGHER EDUCATION CURRICULUM REVIEW TEAMS. 7 (a) For each subject undergoing a review for the purpose of 8 9 identifying and adopting the essential knowledge and skills of a subject of the required curriculum under Section 28.002, the 10 commissioner of higher education shall appoint a higher education 11 12 curriculum review team to review and make recommendations to the State Board of Education concerning the essential knowledge and 13 14 skills to ensure that proposed essential knowledge and skills: (1) are factually accurate and aligned with 15 16 contemporary scholarship; (2) serve to prepare students for college; and 17 18 (3) serve appropriate instructional purposes. (b) Each higher education curriculum review team shall 19 consist of not fewer than five and not more than 10 faculty members 20 of institutions of higher education, as defined by Section 61.003. 21 Each member appointed to a team must have: 22 23 (1) at least five years of higher education teaching 24 experience in the subject under review and a terminal degree in that

2	(2) at least five years of higher education teaching
3	experience in the field of education and a doctoral degree in
4	education.
5	(c) For each higher education curriculum review team, a
6	public institution of higher education may nominate one faculty
7	member qualified under Subsection (b). A nomination made under
8	this subsection must be submitted to the commissioner of higher
9	education together with a document of not more than one page
10	detailing the faculty member's experience, including specific
11	experience with the subject under review by the team.
12	(d) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
13	develop and post on the board's Internet website a blind scoring
14	system for ranking nominations made under Subsection (c) by level
15	of expertise in the subject under review by each higher education
16	curriculum review team.
17	(e) The commissioner of higher education, based on the
18	system developed under Subsection (d), shall make the appointments
19	to each higher education curriculum review team from among persons
20	nominated by institutions of higher education under this section.
21	(f) Notwithstanding Subsections (c) and (e), if the subject
22	under review by a higher education curriculum review team is career
23	and technical education, at least one member of the team must be
24	selected from each of the following institutions:
25	(1) Texas State Technical College System; and
26	(2) Lamar Institute of Technology.
27	(g) In selecting appointees for a higher education

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1	curriculum review team, the commissioner of higher education shall
2	attempt to achieve a balanced combination of educational
3	perspectives.
4	(h) Each higher education curriculum review team shall,
5	before final identification and adoption of the essential knowledge
6	and skills by the State Board of Education, make recommendations to
7	the State Board of Education concerning the essential knowledge and
8	skills.
9	(i) The agency shall post on the agency's Internet website
10	the recommendations of each higher education curriculum review
11	team.
12	(j) The commissioner of higher education shall coordinate
13	with the State Board of Education as necessary for the
14	administration of this section.
15	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
16	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
17	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
18	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
19	Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
