4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 87, Civil Practice and
6	Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 87. LIABILITY ARISING FROM FARM ANIMAL
8	[EQUINE] ACTIVITIES OR LIVESTOCK SHOWS
9	SECTION 2. Section 87.001, Civil Practice and Remedies
10	Code, is amended by amending Subdivisions (1) , (3) , (4) , (5) , (6) ,
11	and (9) and adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as follows:
12	(1) "Engages in <u>a farm animal</u> [an equine] activity"
13	means riding, handling, training, driving, assisting in the medical
14	treatment of, being a passenger on, or assisting a participant or
15	sponsor with <u>a farm</u> [$\frac{an equine}{a}$] animal. The term includes
16	management of a show involving $\underline{\text{farm}}$ [$\underline{\text{equine}}$] animals. The term does
17	not include being a spectator at <u>a farm animal</u> [an equine] activity
18	unless the spectator is in an unauthorized area and in immediate
19	proximity to the farm animal [equine] activity.
20	(2-a) "Farm animal" means:
21	(A) an equine animal;
22	(B) a cow, bull, ox, or other bovine;

- 8 who registers for and is allowed by a livestock show sponsor to

- 11 SECTION 3. Section 87.003, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 12 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 87.003. LIMITATION ON LIABILITY. Except as provided
- 14 by Section 87.004, any person, including <u>a farm animal</u> [an equine]
- 15 activity sponsor, <u>farm animal</u> [equine] professional, livestock
- 16 show participant, or livestock show sponsor, is not liable for
- 17 property damage or damages arising from the personal injury or
- 18 death of a participant in a farm animal [an equine] activity or
- 19 livestock show if the property damage, injury, or death results
- 20 from the dangers or conditions that are an inherent risk of a farm
- 21 <u>animal</u> [an equine] activity or the showing of an animal on a
- 22 competitive basis in a livestock show, including:
- 23 (1) the propensity of <u>a farm animal</u> [an equine] or
- 24 livestock animal to behave in ways that may result in personal
- 25 injury or death to a person on or around it;
- 26 (2) the unpredictability of a farm animal's [an
- 27 equine] or livestock animal's reaction to sound, a sudden movement,

- 1 or an unfamiliar object, person, or other animal;
- 2 (3) with respect to farm animal [equine] activities
- 3 involving equine animals, certain land conditions and hazards,
- 4 including surface and subsurface conditions;
- 5 (4) a collision with another animal or an object; or
- 6 (5) the potential of a participant to act in a
- 7 negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant
- 8 or another, including failing to maintain control over $\underline{a\ farm}$
- 9 $\underline{\text{animal}}$ [the equine] or livestock animal or not acting within the
- 10 participant's ability.
- 11 SECTION 4. Section 87.004, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 12 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 87.004. EXCEPTIONS TO LIMITATION ON LIABILITY. A
- 14 person, including a farm animal [an equine] activity sponsor, farm
- 15 animal [equine] professional, livestock show participant, or
- 16 livestock show sponsor, is liable for property damage or damages
- 17 arising from the personal injury or death caused by a participant in
- 18 a farm animal [an equine] activity or livestock show if:
- 19 (1) the injury or death was caused by faulty equipment
- 20 or tack used in the farm animal [equine] activity or livestock show,
- 21 the person provided the equipment or tack, and the person knew or
- 22 should have known that the equipment or tack was faulty;
- 23 (2) the person provided the <u>farm animal</u> [equine] or
- 24 livestock animal and the person did not make a reasonable and
- 25 prudent effort to determine the ability of the participant to
- 26 engage safely in the farm animal [equine] activity or livestock
- 27 show and determine the ability of the participant to safely manage

- 1 the <u>farm animal</u> [equine] or livestock animal, taking into account
- 2 the participant's representations of ability;
- 3 (3) the injury or death was caused by a dangerous
- 4 latent condition of land for which warning signs, written notices,
- 5 or verbal warnings were not conspicuously posted or provided to the
- 6 participant, and the land was owned, leased, or otherwise under the
- 7 control of the person at the time of the injury or death and the
- 8 person knew of the dangerous latent condition;
- 9 (4) the person committed an act or omission with
- 10 wilful or wanton disregard for the safety of the participant and
- 11 that act or omission caused the injury;
- 12 (5) the person intentionally caused the property
- 13 damage, injury, or death; or
- 14 (6) with respect to a livestock show, the injury or
- 15 death occurred as a result of an activity connected with the
- 16 livestock show and the person invited or otherwise allowed the
- 17 injured or deceased person to participate in the activity and the
- 18 injured or deceased person was not a participant as defined by
- 19 Section 87.001(9)(B).
- SECTION 5. Sections 87.005(a), (b), and (c), Civil Practice
- 21 and Remedies Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) A farm animal [An equine] professional shall post and
- 23 maintain a sign that contains the warning contained in Subsection
- 24 (c) if the professional manages or controls a stable, corral, or
- 25 arena where the professional conducts a farm animal [an equine]
- 26 activity. The professional must post the sign in a clearly visible
- 27 location on or near the stable, corral, or arena.

- 1 A farm animal [An equine] professional shall include the warning contained in Subsection (c) in every written contract that 2 3 the professional enters into with a participant for professional services, instruction, or the rental of equipment or tack or a farm 4 5 [an equine] animal. The warning must be included without regard to whether the contract involves farm animal [equine] activities on or 6 off the location or site of the business of the farm animal [equine] 7 8 professional. The warning must be clearly readable.
- 9 (c) The warning posted by <u>a farm animal</u> [an equine]
 10 professional under this section must be as follows:
- 11 WARNING
- 12 UNDER TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 87, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES
 13 CODE), A FARM ANIMAL [AN EQUINE] PROFESSIONAL IS NOT
 14 LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT IN
 15 FARM ANIMAL [EQUINE] ACTIVITIES RESULTING FROM THE
 16 INHERENT RISKS OF FARM ANIMAL [EQUINE] ACTIVITIES.
- SECTION 6. The change in law made by this Act applies only
 to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of
 this Act. A cause of action that accrues before the effective date
 of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that
 date, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
