4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle G, Title 4, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 325 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 325. ASSISTANCE WITH ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION
8	Sec. 325.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Assistance" means assistance relating to
10	medication, including assisting a person with ordering or
11	reordering medication, assisting a person with selecting the

dosage of the medication.

(2) "Assisted administration of medication" means the taking or applying of medication, by the individual for whom the medication is prescribed or obtained, with the assistance of an

correct medication, and assisting a person with taking the correct

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- 18 <u>(3) "Executive commissioner" means the executive</u> 19 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 20 <u>(4) "Medication management" means the comprehensive</u>
  21 <u>management of medications for the entire course of the medication</u>
  22 <u>therapy by a person receiving medication therapy or for a person</u>
  23 <u>receiving medication therapy, including management of</u>
- 24 over-the-counter and prescription medications.

- 1 Sec. 325.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
- 2 assistance provided to certain persons with intellectual and
- 3 developmental disabilities who are served:
- 4 (1) in a facility licensed under Chapter 252, Health
- 5 and Safety Code; or
- 6 (2) by a Section 1915(c) waiver program, as defined by
- 7 Section 531.001, Government Code, administered by the Department of
- 8 Aging and Disability Services.
- 9 Sec. 325.003. ASSISTED ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION. (a)
- 10 The executive commissioner by rule shall authorize the assisted
- 11 administration of medication without the requirement that a
- 12 registered nurse delegate or oversee each administration.
- 13 (b) The executive commissioner by rule shall:
- 14 (1) require that each person described by Section
- 15 325.002 be assessed to determine the appropriate level of
- 16 <u>assistance the person needs with the administration of medication</u>,
- 17 including an assessment of the person's skills and knowledge of
- 18 over-the-counter and prescription medications;
- 19 (2) establish criteria related to the necessary skills
- 20 and knowledge that must be demonstrated to permit the person to
- 21 receive assisted administration of medication;
- 22 (3) require that each person who receives assisted
- 23 administration of medications receive ongoing training to address
- 24 the person's identified skill and knowledge deficits until the
- 25 person demonstrates competence in independent medication
- 26 management; and
- 27 (4) ensure that each person who receives assisted

- 1 administration of medication has the greatest degree of
- 2 independence in determining the type of assistance needed,
- 3 including through the use of any necessary adaptive or assistive
- 4 aid, device, or strategy.
- 5 Sec. 325.004. UNLICENSED PERSONS AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE
- 6 ASSISTED ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION. (a) An unlicensed person
- 7 who is a member of the staff of a facility described by Section
- 8 325.002 or an employee of a person licensed or certified to provide
- 9 Section 1915(c) waiver program services may be authorized to
- 10 provide assisted administration of medication to a person described
- 11 by Section 325.002 only if the staff member or employee:
- 12 (1) is trained by a registered nurse regarding:
- 13 (A) the role of providing assisted
- 14 administration of medication;
- 15 (B) the responsibilities involved in providing
- 16 assisted administration of medication;
- 17 (C) basic pharmacology;
- 18 (D) medication side effects; and
- 19 (E) techniques for providing assisted
- 20 administration of medication; and
- 21 (2) receives ongoing oversight by a registered nurse
- 22 to ensure continued competence and appropriate performance of the
- 23 staff member's or employee's duties in providing assisted
- 24 administration of medication.
- 25 (b) An unlicensed person providing assisted administration
- 26 of medication shall verify that the correct medication is
- 27 administered in the correct dosage at the correct time of day

- 1 through the correct administration route.
- 2 Sec. 325.005. LICENSED PERSONS REQUIRED TO PROVIDE
- 3 ASSISTANCE WITH ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION TO CERTAIN PERSONS. A
- 4 licensed or certified person who is a member of the staff of a
- 5 facility described by Section 325.002 or an employee of a person
- 6 licensed or certified to provide Section 1915(c) waiver program
- 7 services shall administer medications to a person who does not meet
- 8 the criteria prescribed by Section 325.003(b)(2) to receive
- 9 assisted administration of medication and, as appropriate,
- 10 identify and address the person's skill and knowledge deficits to
- 11 prepare the person to receive assisted administration of medication
- 12 in the future.
- SECTION 2. In developing the rules required by Chapter 325,
- 14 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, the executive
- 15 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 16 convene a work group of affected stakeholders, including public and
- 17 private providers and registered and licensed vocational nurses
- 18 employed by the facilities or providers described by Section
- 19 325.002, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, and other
- 20 persons or entities the executive commissioner considers
- 21 appropriate.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
