A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the audit of retail and mail order pharmacy claims of 3 certain public employees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 1551, Insurance Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 1551.068 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1551.068. AUDIT OF PHARMACY CLAIMS. The state auditor
- 8 shall conduct a biennial audit and submit to the board of trustees a
- 9 report on the claims data for prescriptions for a 90-day supply of
- 10 drugs to verify parity between retail and mail order pharmacies of
- 11 all factors of reimbursement, including average wholesale price and
- 12 maximum allowable cost.

- 13 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 1575, Insurance Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 1575.111 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 1575.111. AUDIT OF PHARMACY CLAIMS. The state auditor
- 16 shall conduct a biennial audit and submit to the trustee a report on
- 17 the claims data for prescriptions for a 90-day supply of drugs to
- 18 verify parity between retail and mail order pharmacies of all
- 19 factors of reimbursement, including average wholesale price and
- 20 maximum allowable cost.
- 21 SECTION 3. The initial audit reports required by Sections
- 22 1551.068 and 1575.111, Insurance Code, as added by this Act, are due
- 23 not later than September 1, 2013.
- SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to

- 1 health benefit plans provided under Chapters 1551 and 1575,
- 2 Insurance Code, beginning with the 2011-2012 plan year. A plan year
- 3 before 2011-2012 is governed by the law as it existed immediately
- 4 before September 1, 2011, and that law is continued in effect for
- 5 that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
