A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

for entering undergraduate students at four-year public

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- 2 relating to a requirement that developmental coursework required
- 4 institutions of higher education be completed at a public junior
- 5 college.

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- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 51.3062, Education Code, is amended by
- 8 adding Subsection (i-2) and amending Subsections (1) and (m) to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 (i-2) A general academic teaching institution that refers a
- 11 student to developmental coursework under Subsection (i) must
- 12 require the student, before enrolling in any coursework at the
- 13 institution, to complete the developmental coursework at a public
- 14 junior college rather than at the institution. If the student was
- 15 admitted to the general academic teaching institution under
- 16 Subchapter U, the student is eligible to enroll in the institution
- 17 when the student successfully completes the developmental
- 18 <u>coursework.</u>
- 19 (1) The legislature shall appropriate money to public
- 20 junior colleges, public technical institutes, and public state
- 21 colleges for approved non-degree-credit developmental courses,
- 22 except that legislative appropriations may not be used for
- 23 developmental coursework taken by a student in excess of [+
- [(1) 18 semester credit hours, for a general academic

teaching institution; and

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- 2 [(2)] 27 semester [credit] hours[, for a public junior 3 college, public technical institute, or public state college].
- 4 The board may develop formulas to supplement the funding 5 of developmental academic programs by institutions of higher education other than general academic teaching institutions, 6 including for supplementing the 7 formulas funding 8 non-course-based programs. The board may develop a performance funding formula by which those institutions may receive additional 9 funding for each student who completes the Success Initiative 10 established under this section and then successfully completes 11 12 college coursework. The legislature may appropriate the money required to provide the additional funding under those formulas. 13
- SECTION 2. A general academic teaching institution shall transfer to the applicable public junior college any funding received by the institution in the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2013, for services rendered by the public junior college under Section 51.3062(i-2), Education Code, as added by this Act, to a student enrolled in the general academic teaching institution.
- SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies beginning with entering undergraduate students at general academic teaching institutions for the 2012 fall semester. A student who enters a general academic teaching institution before the 2012 fall semester is covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
