- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 51.401(c) and (d), Occupations Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) A person whose license has been expired for more than 90
- 8 days but less than 18 months [one year] may renew the license by
- 9 paying to the department a renewal fee that is equal to two times
- 10 the normally required renewal fee. On approval by the executive
- 11 director, a person whose license has been expired for at least 18
- 12 months but less than three years may renew the license by paying to
- 13 the department a renewal fee equal to two times the normally
- 14 <u>required renewal fee.</u>
- (d) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a [A] person whose
- 16 license has been expired for 18 months [one year] or more may not
- 17 renew the license. The person may obtain a new license by complying
- 18 with the requirements and procedures, including the examination
- 19 requirements, for obtaining an original license.
- SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 21 an application for the renewal of a license that is filed with the
- 22 Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation on or after the
- 23 effective date of this Act. An application for the renewal of a
- 24 license that is filed before the effective date of this Act is

- 1 governed by the law in effect on the date the application was filed,
- 2 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
